Hyman "Hy" Goldenberg

Most people know who Hy Goldenberg is because of his outhouse collection and the Tel-Hy Nature Preserve. But there is much more to Hy Goldenberg than just the outhouses.



We will begin this story with his father-in-law, J.L. Brenn, who, at age 12, immigrated to the U.S. from Poland and landed in Chicago. In 1920, he and his wife moved to Huntington, where they bought a brewery on Tipton Street and started making soap in the old vats. This was the beginning of Huntington Laboratories, which eventually produced other products for schools and hospitals, as well as varnish for gym floors.

Huntington Laboratories, today known as Ecolab, continued to be run by the family after J.L. Brenn's death in 1967. His son, Earl Brenn, as president, and son-in-law, Hy Goldenberg, as vice president, managed the business until 1981.

Hy and his wife, Lorraine "Lorry" Brenn Goldenberg, bought property on CR 300W along the Wabash River in the 1960s. Hy hired a crew to build their home, then recognized the need for restroom facilities for the workers. He found an outhouse in Monument City, when residents there were being relocated during the construction of Salamonie Lake. When the



truck driver arrived with the outhouse, he actually had two of them. He thought the one Hy had chosen looked bad, and the other one was better. Hy kept them both and said, "When you have two of anything, you have a collection," thus starting the outhouse collection.

Hy Goldenberg was nationally recognized for his outhouses. Many articles about him and the collection have been written. The Huntington County History and Education Center has a binder containing most of these articles.

After Hy passed away, Lorry donated five of the outhouses to the Huntington County History and Education Center. Hy always called them a piece of Americana that was fading away.

Visit the Huntington County History and Education Center to explore the collection, or walk the trail at Tel-Hy (which, in Hebrew, means "hill" and "life") to see more of the collection.


