
Keynote Speaker



Senator Dave Cortese CA-15

Senator Dave Cortese represents District 15, which encompasses much of Santa Clara County in the heart of Silicon Valley. Along with his accomplished career as an attorney and business owner, the Senator previously served on the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors, the San Jose City Council, and the East Side Union High School District Board. Dave's business involvement includes his early agricultural role as principal in his family farm (wholesale and retail fruit and produce), cattle ranc,h and other organizations, all of which are thriving businesses today.

Looking Back to Moving Forward



Rod Diridon, Sr.

Rod Diridon, Sr., served as executive director of the Mineta Transportation Institute from 1993 to 2014 and is widely known as the father of modern transit in Silicon Valley. He has chaired more than 100 transportation and environmental programs and frequently provides legislative testimony on sustainability. Appointed by Governors Davis and Schwarzenegger, he is chair emeritus of the California High-Speed Rail Authority Board and a past chair of the American Public Transportation Association. He has also led national and international organizations including the Council of University Transportation Centers, the U.S. High Speed Rail Association, and UITP in Brussels. A former elected official, he chaired the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors and the Bay Area's three regional agencies; San Jose Diridon Station is named in his honor. He now leads Rotary Climate Action Councils and holds multiple lifetime achievement awards.

Clarrissa Cabansagan is the Executive Director of the Silicon Valley Bicycle Coalition (SVBC), leading efforts to build healthier, more just communities by making bicycling safe and accessible for all in San Mateo and Santa Clara Counties. She previously served as Policy Director at TransForm, advancing equitable transportation and housing solutions, including efforts to improve first/last mile connections to transit and lowincome access to shared mobility. Earlier in career, she organized bus riders against service cuts with the Oakland-based Urban Habitat and the Los Angeles Bus Riders Union. Clarrissa holds a Master's in Urban Planning from UCLA and a Bachelor's in Ethnic Studies with a minor in City and Regional Planning from UC Berkeley.

Sergio Lopez Chair of VTA/ Mayor of Campbell

Sergio Lopez joined the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) Board of Directors in 2023 and was elected Board Chairperson in late 2024. As the youngest Board Chair in the history of VTA, Sergio brings a personal understanding of public transit, having used the VTA transit system growing up. Sergio Lopez has also served on the Campbell city council since 2020 and was elected as Mayor in 2024. His leadership emphasizes accountability, transparency, and a strong commitment to improving transportation for Santa Clara County residents and visitors. He is also a Director on the Bay Area Air District, where he played a key role in advancing the regional electrification efforts. Sergio is currently pursuing his MBA at UC Berkeley and a Master of Legal Studies at UCLA.

He has served on the Palo Alto City Council for 14 years, including three terms as mayor. Pat led the adoption of the city's 100% Carbon-neutral Electricity, "8030" Goal' of 80% GHG reduction by 2030, and carbon neutrality by 2030. He previously served on the board of the BCDC, is currently a board member on VTA, Caltrain, and MTC.

Daniela uses a trauma-informed community engagement approach, creating safe and inclusive spaces for the most vulnerable populations to share their stories, ensuring their voices are central to the planning process. Currently, Daniela is leading the City of San José ¡Bikeshare En Mayfair! expansion project, funded by the Clean Mobility Options Program and the East San José Mobility Equity Project, and supported by the Sustainable Transportation Equity Project.
