ERA FASHIONS: LADIES SHOES

Styles did not change greatly during 1928-31. There were different shoes for the time of day or occasion. Black, blue, and brown were popular colors. Round toes, square toes and pointed (but not sharp) were shown in all four years. Button shoes were found in 1928-31, but buckles became more popular after 1928. Cuban, Louis, Baby Louis, box, and military heels were all different styles or heights that were mentioned during the years. Any mention of spike heels referred to how thin they were, not how high. A special type of sport shoe worn by ladies to watch sports became know as spectator shoes. The term "sandals" was frequently referred to during the Model A era, but these sandals were not what we consider as sandals today. There were three categories of sandals for the Model A era, casual, beach, and evening. Slippers during the Model A era often referred to evening slippers, a dressy evening shoe worn with formal attire. Generally, evening shoes had a graceful, slender heel. Leathers were seen, but shoes were often of fabric and often dyed to match the gown. Sometimes just the heels of evening shoes were dyed. They also had such decorative trim as buckles, silver kid trim, or embroidery.

Jim's Tech Tip by Jim Cannon

Adding a Passenger Side View Mirror

There are several passenger side mirror options out there for us to add to our car, to see a bit better what traffic is over there. You can get a mirror that attaches to your door hinge, to your wind wing, etc.







But after you install it, you will discover that you really can't see much in it. It is almost useless, especiallywhen trying to help you change lanes.

Here's my little Tech Tip: Add a small "bubble mirror" to the face of that flat mirror, using a couple of strips of two-sided tape. Hunt around for a bubble mirror that closely matches the diameter of your flat mirror. Look for them in auto parts stores, general merchandise stores, truck stops.


Now you will really be able to see what is on that side of the car or truck!


