
## TECH SESSION & DINE & DRIVE—AUGUST 7, 2021

Tour the house, carriage house, and grounds.

11:00 A.M. - Depart McFaddin Ward House. It is about 19 miles from house to Pine Tree Lodge.

From McFaddin Ward House Model A's will exit right onto McFaddin Avenue (in front of house) and take a left onto 4th street then a right onto Calder. Modern cars exit Visitor's Center and take a right onto Calder. Take Calder to 11th Street (about one mile)

Turn left onto 11th Street go about 3 miles to Fannett Road/ Hwy 124.

Take right onto Hwy 124 and go about 4 miles to light at S. Major Drive

Take a left onto S. Major Drive. (It turns into LaBelle Road)

Travel down LaBelle Road for about 10 miles total to get to Pine Tree Road/Fine Tree Lodge Restaurant crossing over Hwy 365. (After crossing 365, it is about 3 miles to Pine Tree Road)

12:00 Noon - Turn left onto Pine Tree Road and arrive at Pine Tree Lodge for lunch.

Depart Pine Tree Lodge after lunch and return to Beaumont same route or however you choose to return home.

**Jim's Tech Tip**

**Working with Jack Stands**

We frequently put our vehicles up on jack stands, to change the oil, grease the chassis, or adjust the brakes. I have a hard time seeing under the car, to see if I have the two jack stands on an axle set to the same height. I sometimes end up with the car leaning to one side or the other when I get one jack stand set to a different height from the other.

Here's what I've done to help my poor eyes: Use a paint pen and number every other ratchet tooth on each jack stand, so that you can quickly set the pair on an axle to the same height.



Holly has a nice collection of these paint pens in her craft stuff, so I borrowed a white one for a few minutes and added some numbers to the teeth. As you can see, the contrast of the white paint makes them easy to read from a distance. I now quickly get them set where I want them.

**Ladies Coordinated Apparel – Outer Garments:**

Outer garments are the outer articles worn to complete an outfit such as coats, jackets, sweaters, scarves, shawls, capes, gbwes, muffs, belts, and aprons. No lady appeared in public without at least a pair of gloves. Most gloves had three gores across the back of the hand either stitched or appliquéd. In the evening, a wrap of some sort was expected. For sports, a pair of gloves, sweater, or sport jacket would be worn. Bathing suits would require a beach coat or beach pajamas. Luxury coats were all fur. Most daytime coats were made of wool or suede velour and had fastenings and/or belts while evening wraps had no fastenings. Fur scarves were worn when going out whether it was to a sporting event, shopping, dinner, or formal evening event. A fox scarf was one of the popular expensive furs worn and a raccoon scarf or coat was one of the popular less expensive furs worn.
