# DeCordova Steam Electric Station WQ0001481000 PLAIN LANGUAGE SUMMARY

The following summary is provided for this pending water quality permit application being reviewed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality as required by 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 39. The information provided in this summary may change during the technical review of the application and are not federal enforceable representations of the permit application.

Luminant Generation Company LLC (CN603256413) operates the DeCordova Steam Electric Station (RN100664812), located at 4950 Power Plant Court, Granbury, Hood County, Texas 76048. The facility currently consists of four (4) natural gas-fired combustion turbines and a 350MW battery storage facility.

This application is for the renewal of Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0001481000 (EPA I.D. No. TX0046400) which authorizes the discharge of wastewaters (once-through cooling and auxiliary cooling water) and previously monitored effluent (floor/equipment drains, equipment blowdown, water treatment wastes, low volume waste, metal cleaning waste and storm water) at a daily average flow not to exceed 1,041.48 million gallons per day via Outfall 001. However, at this time, the steam unit has been demolished. In its current status, the facility does not divert or consume water from the reservoir for use in its once-through cooling systems. Only a small amount of miscellaneous service water is diverted from the reservoir for use at the combustion turbines.

The discharge of once-through cooling water via Outfall 001 and previously monitored effluent via Outfall 101 and 201 from this facility is subject to federal effluent limitation guidelines at 40 CFR Part 423. The pollutants expected from these discharges based on 40 CFR Part 423 are: total residual chlorine, free available chlorine, total suspended solids, oil and grease, total iron, total copper and pH. Temperature is also expected from discharges of 001.

The raw water supply for the facility's cooling water system is from Lake Granbury Reservoir, supplied by the Brazos River Authority. Groundwater from two on-site wells is used at the facility to generate demineralized process water, service water and fire water. A chemical feed system supplies water conditioning chemicals to the once-through cooling water to minimize corrosion and control the formation of mineral scale and bio-fouling. Domestic wastes are routed to an on-site septic system for disposal.

## NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF APPLICATION AND INTENT TO OBTAIN WATER QUALITY PERMIT RENEWAL

#### PERMIT NO. WQ0001481000

APPLICATION. Luminant Generation Company LLC, 6555 Sierra Drive, Irving, Texas 75039, which owns an electricity generation plant, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to renew Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0001481000 (EPA I.D. No. TX0046400) to authorize the discharg of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 1,041,480,000 gallons per day. The facility is located at 4950 Power Plant Court, near the city of Granbury, in Hood County, Texas 76048. The discharge route is from the plant site via the discharge canal directly to Lake Granbury. TCEQ received this application on March 22, 2024. The permit application will be available for viewing and copying at Hood County Clerk's Office, 1200 West, Pearl Street, Granbury, in Hood County, Texas prior to the date this notice is published in the newspaper. ADDITIONAL NOTICE. TCEQ's Executive Director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. After technical review of the application is complete, the Executive Director may prepare a draft permit and will issue a preliminary decision on the application. Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the countywide mailing list and to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the deadline for submitting public comments.

**PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting on this application.** The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments, and the Executive Director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period and, the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period.

TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit for discharge of wastewater without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.

MAILING LIST. If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk. In addition, you may request to be placed on: (1) the permanent mailing list for a specific applicant name and permit number; and/or (2) the mailing list for a specific county. If you wish to be placed on the permanent and/or the county mailing list, clearly specify which list(s) and send your request to TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.
