Data Collection & Analysis

- Participate in walkability and bikeability assessments and audits
- Review existing transportation plans, policies and pedestrian/bicycle network conditions
- Identify barriers, network gaps and opportunities in the existing transportation network to inform plan recommendations
- Set up and maintain Geographic Information System (GIS) maps and produce map deliverables
- Draft existing conditions reports

- Familiarity with pedestrian and bicycle safety analysis methods, as well as traffic calming design methods and their applications
- Experience with public and stakeholder engagement, including online tools (surveys, interactive maps, project websites)
- Knowledge of transportation policy review and analysis at the local or state level
- Experience participating in or leading walk audits or field-based assessments
- Comfort with community event facilitation and outreach communications
- Experience in plan document production and layout (Adobe InDesign, Canva or similar)
