



- Access to new & potentially better treatments
- Expert medical supervision
- Reduced treatment costs
- Contributing to future cancer research

Benefits for Patients

- Unknown side effects
- Possibility of placebo group assignment
- Time commitment & travel requirements
- Regular monitoring & testing
- Uncertain outcomes

- 1. Understand your condition & treatment history
- 2. Search trial databases with specific criteria
- 3. Check eligibility requirements carefully
- 4. Contact trial coordinators for screening
- 5. Review informed consent documents
- 6. Discuss options with your healthcare team

Steps to Find a Trial

Key Information for Trial Search:

- Current stage of cancer
- Previous treatments received
- PSA levels and progression
- Genetic testing results (if any)
- Ability to travel for treatment
- Insurance coverage details

What You Need to Know

- The structured nature of the trial process
- The importance of understanding eligibility criteria
- The value of local resources in San Diego
- The need to discuss participation with healthcare providers
- Remember to check ClinicalTrials.gov for the most current trial information
