Bailey Lakes Village Council – July 27, 2026 Meeting Highlights

At the July 27 Regular Council Meeting, Councilwoman Dottie Smith served as acting mayor in the absence of Mayor John Benshoff and Council President Tina Killion.

After previously reviewing TextMyGov and Reach Alert as options for improving communication with residents, council voted to move forward with Reach Alert as the Village's new community notification system. Council also discussed pest control for Village Hall.

Council reflected on the success of the recent America 250 Celebration, which brought approximately 150 people to Village Hall as part of the community-wide celebration with Savannah. Remaining supplies and historical items from the event will be stored at Village Hall, and special thanks were extended to everyone who helped organize and carry out the celebration.

Council was informed that Village water/sewer operator Cody Pitsenbarger plans to allow his current contract to automatically renew.

Information was received about the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, and council discussed sharing the program with local families while also reminding residents about the Little Free Library available in the Village.

Council members also discussed community outreach, including welcoming new residents and sending cards to residents for occasions such as illness. Looking ahead to fall, discussion began on a possible Halloween event at Village Hall for children and families. Ideas included a trunk-or-treat in the parking lot, food and activities inside Village Hall, and possibly extending the amount of time available for children to trick-or-treat.

Bailey Lakes Village Council – August 10, 2026 Meeting Highlights

Prior to the August 10 Regular Council Meeting, Village officials completed required IT/cybersecurity training in accordance with Ohio House Bill 96.

During the meeting, council received an update on the Village's tax budget and Certificate of Estimated Resources, with a related resolution expected to be considered by the end of September. Minutes from the July 13 and July 27 regular meetings were approved, along with the July financial reconciliation.

Council reviewed proposals for pest control services at Village Hall and voted to contract with Rose Pest Control Solutions. Council also received reports regarding James Lake, Village water and sewer operator's report. Village officials continue to look into a locked dumpster for Village Hall that would be serviced monthly.

Several ongoing infrastructure and maintenance projects were discussed. Work involving the sewer plant auger is expected to be ready in September, and the Village continues preparations for Ringler Park. Officials are also continuing to explore options for camera equipment that could be used to inspect sewer lines and storm water pipes.

Council members brought forward several items for future consideration, including establishing official Village email addresses for council members and officials, obtaining estimates for repairs and improvements to Village Hall, exploring additional storage options, and other property and equipment needs. Council also briefly discussed mowing and snow removal services and addressed several questions and concerns brought to the Village's attention.

To all Residents of Bailey Lakes:

We understand the importance of communicating with you to ensure that we keep you in the loop regarding events affecting our community. As a result, we are pleased to announce that we are initiating a new alert and notification service called **REACH Alert**.

This new service will allow us to immediately share important information regarding a number of items, including waterline breaks/boil water advisories, road closures/delays due to construction or accidents, hazmat situations, AMBER/Silver alerts, police actions, and civic events.

As good as this service is, if you don't register, we can't share important information with you. You decide if you want to receive a text message, voice call, or an email. Each household can register as many phone numbers and email addresses as you need. All you need to do is:

1. Go to www.reachalert.com and click on **SIGN UP (top of page, far right)**.
2. **Network:** type **Village of Bailey Lakes** and select our name from the dropdown list.
3. Follow the prompts and enter your preferred contact information.
4. After you enter your address, click on the confirmation box when it appears in the drop-down.

Once you have successfully completed your registration, **REACH Alert** will send you a confirmation text or email. If you do not receive this message, please call Reach Alert.

If you do not have access to a computer or if you experience any difficulty registering, please contact REACH Alert at (877) 307-9313. They will help complete your registration in about 1 minute!

Remember, if you don't register, you won't receive our messages.

♥ Frosted ♥ *Strawberry Tart* Cookie Cups

Ingredients:

- 1 box Pillsbury White Cake Mix
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup oil
- Muffin tin
- Strawberry jam
- 1 ½ cups powdered sugar
- 1-2 Tbsp water
- Red sanding sugar

Directions:

- 1 Preheat oven to 350°F and spray a muffin tin with nonstick cooking spray.
- 2 Combine cake mix, eggs, and oil until a smooth dough forms.
- 3 Scoop out 12 half scoops of dough and roll into balls for the tops. Set aside.
- 4 Scoop remaining dough into prepared muffin tin.
- 5 Bake for 5 minutes. Remove from oven and create a well for the jam.
- 6 Add jam, flatten reserved dough balls, and place on top to seal.
- 7 Bake an additional 5-8 minutes until tops are set. Let cool completely.
- 8 Combine powdered sugar and water until smooth.
- 9 Dip cooled cookie cups into frosting and top with sprinkles.
- 10 Let frosting harden for at least 30 minutes before enjoying! ♥

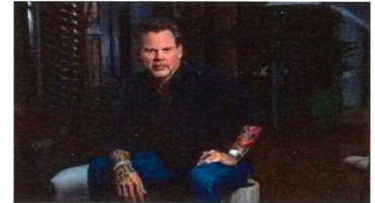
