Prior to the meeting, Council hosted a reception for Tim Hickey and Dave Pitsenbarger to wish them well in their retirement from the Village.

Meeting was held via Facebook live

Roll call of those present: Mayor: John Benshoff. Council Members: Ariel Isaacs, Dottie Scott, Krissy Kauf, Tom Dilgard, Tina Killion. Fiscal Officer: Leighanna Cawrse. Water & Sewer Operators: Tim Hickey and David Pitsenbarger. Public: Christine Barker, David Kauf

Council discussed a proposal received for a replacement for water distribution and sewer operation.

A public hearing for the 2026 tax budget was held.

The village has an opening for a zoning inspector and will be accepting applications for said position soon.

Council discussed setting a salary range for Village Administrator from \$600 to \$1,200.00 per month based on experience.

Bates Outdoor Management – snow plowing will remain \$2,500.00/month from December 2025 through March 2027.

Road paving began Monday, July 14th.

Dottie Scott: A resident would like to have a 21-gun salute during a memorial on August 31st. Recommended anyone running for council to pick up a candidate packet from the Ashland County Board of Elections, it has valuable information.

Council discussed Zoning Inspector job position/description and Richard Brown was appointed Zoning Inspector. Council discussed the vacant council seat, and Betty Brown was nominated and voted to fill the vacant seat for the unexpired council term.

Mayor Benshoff discussed paving project currently ongoing. Discussed auger motor repaired at the water/sewer plant and a plan for monitoring that. Discussed flow meter installation set for September 15, 2025. Discussed tree trimming in the village.

Dottie Scott: Asked Council to look over a letter received from the Ethics Commission.

Krissy Kauf: Inquired about the status of a possible donation to match the grant for the parks. Ariel Isaacs informed Krissy that the meeting was canceled for a grant to match the grant for the parks due to illness, will be rescheduled. Krissy asked that the property owner request to have an alley vacated be placed on the agenda for the next meeting along with the letter regarding ethics, and the grate and culvert estimate. Also inquired when the tornado siren will be updated.

The new Ashland County Emergency Alert System has changed from WENS to CodeRED.


There are several ways residents can sign up for CodeRed.

You will create an account and enter your demographic information, then sign up for alerts.



If you were signed up through the former system, WENS, to receive alerts before May 1st, you should still be getting alerts on the new system. There is also a **CodeRED mobile app available** for Android and iOS.







Italian Nut Roll Cookies

Ingredients

For the Dough:

- 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

For the Filling:

- 1 cup finely ground walnuts
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg



ITALIAN NUT ROLL COOKIES

YOU WILL NEED

For the Dough:
1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened
1 cup granulated sugar

Instructions

Make the Dough:

- In a large bowl, cream together the softened butter and granulated sugar until light and fluffy.
- Beat in the eggs one at a time, then add the vanilla extract.
- In a separate bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, and salt.
- Gradually add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients, mixing until just combined.
- Divide the dough in half, wrap each half in plastic wrap, and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes.

Make the Filling: In a bowl, combine the ground walnuts, granulated sugar, powdered sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg.

Assemble and Bake:

- Preheat oven to 350°F (175°C).
- Roll out one half of the dough on a lightly floured surface to a 1/4-inch thickness.
- Spread the nut filling evenly over the rolled-out dough.
- Roll up the dough tightly in a jelly-roll style.
- Cut the roll into 1-inch slices.
- Place the slices on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- Bake for 12-15 minutes, or until the cookies are golden brown.
- Let the cookies cool on the baking sheet for a few minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.
