APRIL 14TH REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING SYNOPSIS:

Meeting called to order at 6 p.m. and roll was called. In attendance were the following: Ariel Isaacs, Dottie Scott, Krissy Kauf, Tina Killion, Tom Dilgard, Justin Isaacs, Leighanna Cawrse (at 6:37 p.m.), Tim Hickey, Dave Pitsenbarger, and Patrick Miller.

The meeting held via Facebook live beginning at 6:37 p.m.

By reason of Mayor John Benshoff's absence, Council President Ariel Isaacs was acting mayor.

Changes to the agenda included a zoning appeals form was presented and approved by council.

The March 10th and 24th meeting minutes were tabled.

Ariel Isaacs opened the sealed bid from Melway Paving Co, Inc. in the amount of \$135,487.50. Ariel mentioned that she had contacted Melway and Ashland County Engineer prior to the meeting to get their opinion on paving verses motor paving and agreed that motor paving seemed like the right decision at this time if the funds were there. Council agreed to wait to discuss when fiscal officer was present so that they could discuss financials. Upon Leighanna Cawrse's arrival, council discussed paving, prioritizing roads, and the financial aspects.

Fiscal reports were read, discussed and approved.

There were no new Ordinances read or discussed:

Two bollards are cracked by the village hall drive/parking lot – Justin Isaacs will patch/repair these and village will only pay for the concrete (no labor cost as he is a council member).

Council discussed a community trash/junk pick-up day via Countryside Trash. Council declined the opportunity.

Krissy Kauf requested that a review of the village's Asset Management Plan be placed on the agenda for the next meeting, April 28, 2025. The village Asset Management Plan outlines steps for emergencies such as a sewer plant failure, water, electricity, etc.

Council discussed RCAP/I&I: Krissy Kauf discussed 2 houses with downspouts that are running into the sewer. Must prioritize locating areas of infiltration and fixing them. RCAP will provide a new GIS map with updated water and sewer lines for the village. They will work on getting us on schedule for this year for the tracker to locate infiltration areas, next year – camera as supplies are limited. The village has been put on notice by the EPA. Based upon the last rain event, the west side of the village should be prioritized. RCAP will put village on the list for flow meters beginning on west side.

Council Reports:

- Dottie Scott: Having meeting minutes sent to council members before each meeting is a must.
- Krissy Kauf: None.
- Tina Killion: None.
- Ariel Isaacs: Sending information to the solicitor to create a resolution for a village administrator.
- Justin Isaacs: Still working on soffit and tree removal.
- Tom Dilgard: Suggested the speed limit on side streets be changed from 25 mph to 10 mph.

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Operator's Report/Water-Sewer: The operator's report was read and projects discussed including; 1) re-grading needed in multiple locations around the village, 2) sump pumps and downspouts needing to be removed to prevent overloading the system, 3) catch basin at Friendly Express needs a new concrete structure, 4) pot holes on main roads, 5) a tree in James Lake, 6) areas needing to be seeded, 7) ground hog holes at WTP, 8) Burning a brush pile at WTP, 9) water repair on McClain, 10) a catch basin on Wesley, etc.

Parks: A meeting will take place at the Ashland County Commissioner's office on May 7th regarding the grant for the parks. Ariel Isaacs will attend.

Zoning:

- Patrick Miller spoke on zoning permits that he had received, including (2) fencing permits that were not ready yet.
- Patrick Miller inquired about the chicken ordinance and believes the village should require residents to draw a picture of where the chicken coop will be positioned so that he knows where to locate the coops when he's "driving around to make sure they're compliant." Ariel Isaacs reminded Patrick Miller that the chicken ordinance is not part of zoning and that he will not be approving the permits for chickens; therefore, he is only to get involved if someone files a complaint. Justin Isaacs stated that some people prefer mobile chicken coops and might want to move them around the yard. Justin solicited discussion from council and council was in agreement that they do not require a picture of where the coop is at.
- Patrick Miller then stated that he wants/needs a list of all residents applying for chicken permits so that he knows who has them and who
 does not
- A zoning appeals form created by C. Gaubatz was presented and approved by council (see above, changes to agenda).
- A <u>draft</u> of a general zoning permit application created by C. Gaubatz is being reviewed by council and will be adjusted by council according to Bailey Lake's zoning needs.

There was no public interaction to address in person or via live-stream.

Given that there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:37 p.m.

Monday, April 28th, and Monday, May 10th are the next scheduled regular meetings. The May 26th meeting is canceled due to the holiday.

Meeting minutes are not approved until the next month's council meeting. The cost to file is \$30, 10 signatures are needed, and the filing deadline is August 6, 2025 for the General Election on November 4, 2025.



Longhorn Steakhouse Copycat Crispy Brussels Sprouts Recipe

Prep Time: 5 minutes. Cook Time: 20 minutes.

Total Time: 25 minutes.

Ingredients

Crispy Brussels Sprouts

- 1 lb brussels sprouts cleaned
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 teaspoon sea salt

Sauce

- 2 tablespoons butter melted
- ½ teaspoon chili powder or Calabrian chili powder
- ½ teaspoon smoked paprika
- ½ teaspoon sea salt
- 1 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1 teaspoon maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon honey



Instructions

- 1) Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Line a large baking sheet with aluminum foil and spray with cooking spray, or rub the pan with butter. Do not use parchment paper, or they will steam.
- 2) Boil a large pot of water and add salt. Prepare Brussels sprouts by peeling off the exterior shell, if damaged, and cutting off the stems.
- 3) Blanch the cleaned Brussels sprouts for 5-7 minutes, or until fork tender, in the boiling water. Remove the sprouts and place them into a large bowl. Cool for 5 minutes, or place them in an ice bath for 30 seconds. Pat them dry with paper towels.
- 4) Cut the Brussels sprouts in half (this will help them get more sauce than leaving them whole). Toss them with olive oil and salt. Roast the Brussels sprouts in the oven for 20-25 minutes or until golden brown and crispy edges. Roast and stir halfway through cooking time.
- 5) In a small bowl combine melted butter, chili powder, paprika, salt, red pepper flakes, honey, and syrup and whisk until combined.
- 6) Remove the tray from the oven and toss the crispy brussel sprouts with the prepared sauce. Place on a large flat serving platter and serve hot!

Notes

- The key to getting perfectly crispy Brussels sprouts is baking them at a high temperature in the oven. I recommend using a greased baking sheet or aluminum foil on a baking tray and not using parchment paper. The parchment paper will produce more steamed Brussels sprouts instead of crispy ones.
- Storing and Reheating
- Fridge Transfer the leftover Brussels sprouts to an airtight container or a jar with a lid and keep them in the fridge for up to 3 days.
- Freezer—You can freeze the leftover sprouts in a freezer container for up to 3 months. Make a fresh spicy sauce and add it after reheating.
- Reheating The best way to reheat your leftover crispy Brussels sprouts is to bake them in the oven. Simple preheated oven at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for 4 to 5 mins, or quickly toss them in a hot skillet or pan. You can also reheat them for 1-2 in the microwave.
- I recommend adding more sauce to the Brussels sprouts after reheating them.
