The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM.

PRESENTATION

Aqua Doc® Aquatic Specialist, Alex Boskovic was present via Zoom to discuss treatment at James Lake.

Council recessed their regular meeting to enter into executive session under ORC 121.22 G(1) from 6:17 p.m. to 7:10 p.m., resuming the regular council meeting at 7:12 p.m.

MOTIONS/DISCUSSION

- July and September water/sewer reports are still pending, August was received and reviewed.
- September 8th and 22nd regular meeting minutes were discussed and motions were made Approved meeting minutes are available to download on the Village website: baileylakes.org
- Details were discussed regarding the Village Trick-or-Treat night, end time was changed to 7 p.m.
- 32+ year village resident, Richard Brown was hired as the Village Administrator.
- Discussion was continued with village property owner Christina Barker regarding vacating First Street.
- Estimates from Soupy Enterprises and Dave Barton & Sons were discussed by council. Estimate was accepted from Soupy Enterprises to complete work on a catch basin at the Friendly Express.


Christmas Meal Program

Assistance is provided for families with a minor child.

A completed and signed application, verification of entire household income for the last 30 days, and a heating bill is required. If there is 0.00 income in the household, provide a written statement. If all the information is not provided, your application will be denied.

From October 13, 2025 through April 15, 2026 the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) offers a Special Reconnect Order for the upcoming winter heating season. Any residential customer of a PUCO-regulated electric or natural gas company may take advantage of the provisions contained in the order once per winter heating season. This is not just for reconnections, but take advantage of it if you find yourself struggling to pay your bill this heating season. Homemade Gold ish Crackers

Ingredients

- 8 oz sharp cheddar cheese, finely grated
- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon celery salt
- 1/2 teaspoon onion powder
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter, chilled
- 4-5 tablespoons cold water
- Goldfish cookie cutter (optional)



Instructions

- Finely shred your cheese with a cheese grater and add to a food processor. Process until cheese is very finely chopped. (This will ensure that the cheese becomes well incorporated in the dough.)
- 2) Add in flour, salt, sugar, baking powder, paprika, celery salt, and onion powder and pulse until evenly incorporated.
- 3) Add in butter and 4 tbsp cold water and pulse a few more times.
- 4) Move the dough to a work surface and knead until it forms a dough that sticks together. If it's still crumbly, add more water in small increments until it comes together. Divide dough in half and shape into two 1" thick discs. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes to an hour.
- 5) Meanwhile, preheat oven to 350°F and line two large baking sheets with parchment paper.
- 6) On a floured work surface, roll out each dough disc into a roughly 9-10" by 11" rectangle. It should be about 1/8" thick. Use your cookie cutter to cut the goldfish, and move to a parchment-lined baking sheet and sprinkle with salt to taste. You can re-roll any dough scraps.

Notes

Add the goldfish face: For the eye, just stick a skewer or fork tine all the way through the cracker. To make the famous smile, press the edge of a teaspoon-sized measuring spoon (or a small regular spoon) into the cracker. It'll take a few tries to get it right, but once you get the hang of it, you'll have a bunch of smiling goldfish.

Baking time: Ours took about 16 minutes to bake. They'll be done when the bottoms are slightly browned. You want to make sure you don't take them out when the bottoms are still pale, because they just won't be crunchy.


Sprinkle with salt before baking: This step is easy to forget, but it adds a lot of flavor. Don't forget it!

No goldfish cookie cutter? No problem. Use a bottle cap to cut these into round oyster-style crackers. Alternatively, you can cut them into squares (like our cheez-its) or any other shape.

Storage: Keep these stored in an airtight container for about a week. If they start to lose their crispness, pop them back in the oven for a few minutes.




