## Highlights from the 22nd World Orchid Conference Guayaquil Ecuador, Nov. 8-12, 2017 by Nile Dusdieker

Nile and Lois Dusdieker represented the Eastern Iowa Orchid Society at the WOC last month. They participated in orchid judging and attended many interesting scientific sessions. Nile will share a short presentation about the show at our December holiday gathering. The small flowered *Dendrobium parvulum* pictured on the first page received Best Species and Grand Champion plant in the show. It was previously awarded a CHM/AOS in 2015 to Ecuagenera with 144 flowers. This species is from New Guinea and is notoriously difficult to grow in captivity. A close-up of the spectacular blue flowers is shown below. Reserve Grand Champion went to *Oncidium naevium* which was an *Odontoglossum* prior to name change. Native to cool, shady areas in Columbia and Venezuela. (Below right) A couple outstanding displays are shown at the bottom of the page. The Thailand exhibit on the left received 2nd place and the Taiwan Orchid Growers display of all Phalaenopsis was a review of the things to come when the next WOC is in Taiwan in 2020.
