This is **Taeniophyllum obtusum** (pusillum) awarded a Certificate of Botanical Recognition at January Chicago Judging to John Stuckert of Pewaukee, WI. This orchid grows on mangrove and coffee trees in South China and SE Asia under intermediate to warm temperatures and dappled light. What's wrong? There are no leaves! This orchid is similar to the 'Ghost Orchid' that grows in Florida, Dendrophylax lindenii, also leafless. Tiny, cute, flowers!

Four Lovely EIOS Member Plants taken to Chicago for Judging in January



Results: TWO AOS Awards; ONE 'want-a-be'; and ONE not quite ! By Nile Dusdieker

Phalaenopsis Da-Chien Spider Beauty in the back had 32 flowers on two inflorescences from Noelridge's collection. Flower size and substance didn't quite compare with other awards but judges commended the grower for the gorgeous flower presentation.

Tolumnia (syn. **Oncidium**) Lambada 'Cutey' shown on the left is a magnificent bloomer grown by Bill Englert who also does the Bonsai plants. Judges wanted to give a cultural award to the plant and grower but they questioned the parentage. Tolumnias are much smaller orchids, grow on rocks, and do not have distinct pseudobulbs. To make things more confusing, Orchid Wiz shows this exact plant receiving an award at a show in Spain in 2011. I think this is probably an intergeneric cross with a *Miltonia* added to the background. Fortunately Bill has the original name tag and maybe he can call the nursery and get more information. The Judges deemed the plant 'not judged' so if it still looks good for the Minn. Show - it can be looked at again.

Cattleya Kirstie King 'Iowa' HCC/AOS shown in the middle, is an old large lavender *Cattleya* cross made in 1991 by EFG Orchids. This is not a mericlone but rather a seedling that Doc. Bannister has been growing for a number of years. Parents are C. Lake Chabaneau by C. Drumbeat 'Heritage' and this hybrid shows the best of both. Flowers were 16 cm across with a lovely round ruffled lip. This just goes to show that some of the 'old' crosses still have what it takes to get an award. We don't see these that often at shows any more!

Lycaste Abou First Spring 'Timberlane' CCM/AOS shown on the right received the cultural award for a marvelous specimen plant with 14 flowers and 3 buds. Marcia Whitmore brought the plant to the Illowa meeting still with many buds to open and Andy convinced her to let us take it home with us and to judging the next week. Hopefully it will also stay in bloom for the Minn. Show. More pictures on next page!
