# Three Down and Three to GO: EIOS Spring Show Season Now Half Over!

Two hundred plant entries later with 126 ribbons and special awards received, EIOS finds itself at the half way point in our Spring show season. We have had great success and setup truly beautiful displays.

Our first show was the Orchid Society of Minnesota Winter Carnival Show at the Como Arboretum in St. Paul Jan 28-29, 2017. Our exhibit received 1st place and Best of Class for Orchid Society Exhibits and Nile and Lois Dusdieker received the EUROS (Prince of the East Winds) Trophy for best Old World species for their *Dendrobium kingianum*.

One week later, the Orchid Growers Guild—Orchid Quest was held at a new location in Madison, Wisconsin—the Olbrich Gardens and Arboretum. Our display again received 1st place and had a bit of a new look sitting up against a rock wall at a slight diagonal.


By the time many of these flowers made it to the Batavia show at the DuPage County Fairgrounds on February 18-19th, they were well worn. We still received many ribbons and Best of Class and Best Specimen plant for Noelridge's Noel 2 a lovely no-namei Cymbidium which we placed front and center. Doc Bannister's Phal. Mount Lip was Best of Class Phalaenopsis.





