



EIOS member, Marcia Whitmore who lives just across the Mississippi is an amazing orchid grower with many of her flowers seen in these newsletters. She also is an impressive artist, She likes to paint her favorite orchids.

Several of these have been featured in Orchids Magazine. She recently submitted her paintings here to the Batavia Virtual Orchid Show and received several virtual ribbons plus Best of Class designation. (See right)

Marcia sent the following information: "I do most of my watercolors from my own plants or sketches I've done while out looking for orchids. All of the paintings entered in Batavia are from plants I grow. I start by drawing the subject on drafting paper. I do all corrections, erasers and redraws on that paper until I'm satisfied

with the drawing. Then I flip the drafting paper over and trace the drawing on the back. I place the drawing right side up on the paper I've chosen for the watercolor and go over the entire drawing

which transfers a light drawing to the painting surface. Lately I've

been working with Prismacolor pencils on grey/green Strathmore paper. I'm really enjoying this new direction....this is an example. For the best results, white or pastel flowers work the best.

What a wonderful talent! We have the *Galearis* in our dining room - it always reminds me of spring, especially in cold cold February days! NILE D





What To DO?


This great old cattleya has seen better days. What is shown here are color breaks in the flowers highly suspicious for a virus infection. The page at the right is taken from Sue Bottom's Pest and Diseases pdf from *features* on our website. To prove my case I did a virus test (same technology as the Covid quick tests) using the virus testing kit from Agdia. Some will remember when we had a speaker from the Elkhart Indiana company talk to our club a few years ago. Their test strips check for 2 of the most


Symptoms — CHIDIOLIC and necrotic spots, streaks, lines and rings in the leaves. Flowers may show necrotic spots and streaks as well as color break. The virus, if present, is present in all parts of the plant.

Treatment – There is no treatment for a virused plant. Destroy the plant to prevent it from infecting other plants. If the plant is valuable, isolate it completely from other plants and follow precautions to prevent infecting other plants.
