Springtime Orchids in the Woods!

Folks remember our first in-person meeting last year for the Amana nature walk looking for the Iowa native orchid, Putty Root? *(Aplectrum hyemale)* We were a little late, but found some seed pods and one bloom stem with a couple wilted flowers What we didn't find was any orchid leaves!



That is because they form in the fall and remain till spring. These are leaves we recently found looking for mushrooms, which we didn't find yet. The leaves will wilt when the plant starts to form a flower spike. These are fairly commonly seen in the woods this time of year. Nile

EIOS setup a small orchid display that featured several Vandas in bloom. I can take credit for the big blue but the others were just brought back from RF Orchids in Florida. We had a couple multifloral paphiopedilums, miltonias, and the centerpiece was *Guarianthe skinneri* var. oculata (white but with a touch of lavender in the throat of the lip) - desperately needs to be repotted!

We sold about 50 orchids all donated to the club by our member **Robert Bannister. THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU!** He brought back a few mini-cattleyas and they went fast toomuch to my surprise! The club always packages the plants in boxes with tissue paper which enhances the presentation and we wrapped them in plastic bags to carry outside as it was still cold!

We had great volunteer help both days and special thanks to all those who participated. Lori Farmer, the new greenhouse director was very appreciative of our participation as I think they had fewer vendors this year. She said about 800 people came through during the two days.

Gators and Orchids Galore: in the Florida Everglades!

Lois and I have been to the everglades many times in the past. We walked in the Fakahatchee swamp in 2009 with the Van Hyftes. My how things have changed! The Ta-Miami trail has been upgraded and now is a speedway. Miami has grown westward into the swamp. With development, several ecologic changes have also been made. Several long bridges have been added to allow the fresh water of the glades to readily pass under the developed road barrier. A little known side road called the 'loop road' offered a more leisurely drive with time to stop and see the wildlife (not too close however) The trees were covered with moss and bromeliads. I'm sure orchids were there as well but not in bloom. The main attraction was the alligators - they were everywhere - and they were big!





One of the speakers at the AOS meeting talked on Florida native orchids and I asked him afterward if he knew of any currently in bloom close by. He gave us simple directions to a pine grove prairie in Everglades National Park where we found many Grass Pinks - Calopogons. He had visited the area 2 weeks prior and said the field was literally pink - not so for us, but still re-

warding. Here are several photos of *Calopogon tuberosus* we found scattered amongst the grasses. The color variation was impressive. As usual, Lois found the first

one! We also learned about an absolutely great website for identifying native orchids. https://goorchids.northamericanorchidcenter.org (or just Google GoOrchids) This will list native orchids by state or location and offers a field guide to identification.
