As cool weather approaches, our growing conditions change. Our plants can be exposed to a more confined environment. They can experience less air movement, decreased humidity, and cooler temps. Watch for pests like mealy bugs and scale.

One more thing to think about. There is an increasing amount of direct sunlight coming in your south window where your orchids might be. Be careful, don't let your orchids get sunburned by the sun's rays.

We've Still Got IT! EIOS wins big in Wisconsin

On Friday 9/16 several members gathered in the rather 'hot' Mitchel Park Domes in Milwaukee, WI to setup what we thought would be a small display. By the time all the plants arrived, that was not to be the case. We were told the location would be small on the terrace but fortunately the Parks staff let the show move to the show dome floor as in years past. We started with tiered tables covered with black cloth. Then we decided which were our feature or focal point plants. Bruce Byorum sent several pendant catesetums which required special locations to project the inflorescences (and we remembered not to touch the flower or it would 'shoot' pollen at us!).



When the plants were placed - we needed more room so we turned over the tubs and added them to the display. The final result was really quite spectacular. The club won a 1st place ribbon, Best of Class orchid society



display, and was scored by the judges to receive the Show Trophy (best display in the show) and a Silver Certificate of 86 points. The scoring consists of 1/3 arrangement, 1/3 varied genera, and 1/3 quality of plants. I believe this is only the second Silver Certificate our club has ever received. Special Awards in WSC. for a special grower - Bruce Byorum

When it comes to growing certain genera, some folks just have the knack. Bruce is one of those people who can grow and bloom plants of the Catasetum Alliance. At the Wiscomsin show, his *Catasetum* Fong Cing 'Pat' received AM/AOS 82 pts for a beautiful pendant inflorescence of light green flowers with maroon spotting. In addition, his plant was Best of Class for all catasetums and he received the Memoria Bob Lewis award for the best Catesetum in the show. Bob was an AOS judge that loved to grow these plants and was from Milwaukee. The award photos and description are shown here. *Sixteen flowers on one arching 47.5-cm inflorescence, second small immature*

inflorescence, emerging from pseudobulb base of a 59-cm tall by 39-cm wide plant; flower base color pale green; sepals and petals pointed at apex, finely spotted magenta; lip round, side

MORE AOS AWARDS FROM THE EIOS DISPLAY!

Deno Kandis 'heritage' Vanda (Ascocenda) Fuchs Ruby 'Forest Park' received an AM/AOS 80 pts. Sixteen full, round, flat flowers on one erect 15-cm inflorescence; sepals and petals bright yellow overlaid pumpkin orange; lip mid-lobe rusty red becoming deep red at apex, side lobes golden yellow; column bright yellow, anther cap brown; substance firm; texture crystalline in the sun. This grex was registered by RF Orchids in 1988 as a cross between V. Yip Sum Wah and V. Peggy Foo. It received 4 prior awards from 1992 to 2001 but none since. The color, size and presentation of Deno's plant surpassed them all. Taking a photo in the sunlight increased the WOW factor. Color was described as base color yellow overlaid pumpkin orange. In the center of the exhibit we had a giant Den. spectabile from Bruce Byorum that has really weird twisted flowers. This species must attract some strange pollinators! It received a blue ribbon for specimen plant; blue and Best of Class Dendrobiums. We took it back for AOS judging but it had to

compete with a prior award with nearly 1000 flowers. Yellow was the center of our display with Bill Page's Oncidium Sweet Sugar (upper left in photo above). A number of intergeneric Brassia/Oncidium crosses were featured such as Brascidostele Gilded Tower and Bratonia Shelob, both very popular crosses and commonly available from vendors. One cattleya, C. Ports of Paradise 'Emerald Isle' FCC/AOS in the upper left of photo (right) was blooming

'out of sync' for the Dusdiekers. It is known for its giant yellow-green ruffled lip. Maybe it will bloom again in the Spring as it has a couple sheaths. Jeff Metcalf contributed
