

## *Come to our Orchid Club Meetings!*


The Eastern Iowa Orchid Society meets on the first Thursday of the month except in the summer and the month of January. We pride ourselves as “a small group of people with a big love of growing orchids!”: Our meetings are open to the public and we try to make everyone welcome. Some members have just a couple orchids and others have several hundreds. We all learn to grow from each other and no questions are too simple to ask. Each meeting has a social time to ask questions and enjoy refreshments. A program follows presented by one of our members or a guest speaker. We often have raffle plants and this October will be our plant auction which is a great opportunity to expand one’s collection. We are a friendly group! All members get to choose a blooming orchid at our holiday party in December which for many is the highlight of the year.

Our club is known throughout the Midwest for our orchid displays at regional orchid shows. These are especially rewarding for our members as their plants are judged and receive ribbons at the show as well as possible American Orchid Society recognition with a national award. About 10 of our members past and present have received AOS awards. We are always looking for members to attend shows and help with our displays. All are welcome to participate - we do have a good time!

Education is part of our mission. Members of the club give volunteer lectures to local and regional groups such as Master Gardeners and garden clubs to promote interest in orchids. More formal presentations have been given to national and international orchid forums. Our club is a member of the American Orchid Society (AOS) and the MidAmerican Orchid Congress (MAOC) and the club is well represented at these two organizations’ events.



To promote the appreciation of orchids, the American Orchid Society delivers the most up-to-date, *accurate*, educational information about orchid culture and sponsors research and conservation initiatives to improve the outlook for orchids around the globe.” Since 1921, orchid education has been what the American Orchid Society is all about. At our website ([aos.org](https://aos.org)), you will find information on all aspects of orchids and how to care for your orchids and get them to bloom to their best. The section of the website called “All about orchids” is summarized below:

If you are like most of us, you will be spending a great deal of your AOS website time in this section, whether you are just beginning or have grown orchids for many years. Orchids are all about learning and striving to grow our plants better. You will find helpful tips if you are growing your first orchid under **ORCHID CARE**. The **AOS VIDEO LIBRARY** and **WEBINAR** sections contain how-to topics and lectures by orchid experts and Greenhouse Chats with Q&As about orchid culture.

The **CULTURE SHEETS** cover growing individual genera and can be translated into nearly every language. An **ORCHIDIST’S GLOSSARY** is an alphabetical list of orchid terms and helps you learn how to pronounce the genera names, frequently a challenge. **ORCHIDS A TO Z** gives genera information and culture requirements and has playable sound files with the proper pronunciation.

The **ORCHID PESTS AND DISEASES** section is useful to all of us, and there are two webinars (found under the WEBINAR tab) on Pest and Disease management that you will find very helpful in dealing with these problems. The **KIDS’ CORNER** has tips for sharing your love of orchids with kids. Check out **ADDITIONAL ORCHID RESOURCES** for lots of additional information that includes original material as well as articles from ORCHIDS magazine. Orchid lovers and growers are from all walks of life, with different occupations, but all share a passion for orchids. Once you get it, you are hooked. Orchids bring peace, love, and happiness to your life; they bring a way to escape from the stresses of everyday living. Whether you grow on your windowsill, or under lights in your basement, or outdoors, or in a greenhouse, you are a part of the wonderful orchid community, and, **by being a member of the AOS, you have a home and are part of a close-knit orchid community.** The orchids are amazing and so are orchid people. They are always willing to share their knowledge and love of orchids with others. The AOS exists to serve you, the orchid grower. Among the perks of membership are the outstanding AOS website with accurate, reliable orchid information, the monthly ORCHIDS magazine, and the AOS webinars.


