Klemp, Matt Berry; Cathy Wilcox, Treasurer; Nancy Distler, AOS Representative; Nile Dusdieker, MAOC representative; Michael Hampton Secretary; Bill Snyder, registered agent in charge of filing nonprofit forms. Club currently has about 50 members: quorum was present.

EIOS is a non-profit organization (501c3) with a major emphasis on education of members and the public about orchids. Fund raising activities solely go to meet that purpose. Major activities of the club this year included sponsoring the Eastern Iowa Orchid Show and Sale 'Orchids Are a Scream 2024!' at the Elks Lodge in October, local orchid displays at Easter and Mother's Day Noelridge Showcases, and participation in regional orchid shows throughout the Midwest. We plan to continue eight monthly meetings with educational programs open to the public, some may still occur via ZOOM during winter months. Guest speakers are paid an honorarium and travel expenses if they are not club members. Activities (minutes) of the club are recorded in the quarterly newsletters. A Treasurers report will be given by Cathy Wilcox and will be published in the Spring 2025 newsletter. (See last page of this newsletter)

Changes in OFFICERS: Both Cathy Wilcox and Nile Dusdieker have check signing privileges at our Hills Bank Club account. Cathy requests that her role of Treasurer be passed to new person beginning Jan 2025. Cathy will keep signing privileges and will file 2024 final Treasurers report in January 2025. A preliminary report was given at this meeting. Club revenue to date \$3899; expenses \$1800. CD at Hills Bank \$5200.

MOTION: Nomination for Treasurer Carmen Joslin. Vote passed unanimously

Registered agent for the club that files our tax information yearly has been Bill and Jean Snyder and Nile is willing to do this as he does this for Illowa Club.

MOTION: Nomination for Registered Agent Nile Dusdieker Vote passed unanimous.

Functions of the secretary are handled and recorded in the newsletter by editors Michael Hampton and Nile Dusdieker.

MOTION: to combine the office of secretary with the editors of the newsletter. Vote passed unanimously.

MOTION: To approve the activities of the club and specifically the actions of the officers of the club for 2024 including Treasurer's report and meeting documentation in the newsletter. Vote passed unanimously.

All club activities are provided by members on a purely volunteer basis. This includes meeting preparation, refreshments, representing the club at regional orchid shows and orchid judging events, orchid field trips and arranging speakers and educational programs.

MOTION: The club shall provide documentation of donated volunteer services upon request which states that no goods or services were received by the donors from the club. Vote passed unanimously.

At times the club needs to purchase items for club activities such as holiday food, gift plants, and support items like ribbons and awards for our show. These items may be purchased and paid for by individual club members at the direction of the club officers with bills submitted to club treasurer for reimbursement.

MOTION: The club has a policy to reimburse individual members for purchase of items specifically designated by the officers for general club use. Vote passed unanimously.

MOTION: The club will donate \$100 to the Shueyville Church for use of their facilities for 2024-25 Vote passed unanimously.

OTHER Business: Planning for next year's Orchid Show? As noted in the recent newsletter, a new show chairman and team will need to be determined. This will include determining if the club wishes to continue the show, show date, location, logistics, hospitality. Nile Dusdieker has contacts and lots of information and will gladly help with planning. Discussion followed and members are actively pursuing these matters. Selling orchids to raise funds for our fall show and club activities at the Easter and Mother's Day Noelridge Showcases: We will need volunteers. The club plans to exhibit at several orchid shows in the Mid-West this year: Winter Carnival St Paul 1/24-26/2025, Madison OGG at new location Feb. 1-2, 2025, Racine show and Batavia later in the Spring. MID-WINTER ORCHID SHOWS!


