DEFINING WHAT A LEADER IS BIBLICALLY

Matthew 20:26–28 +

"It shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

A Leader leads with humility, understanding that one has to live the example we want our families to follow. We can't run from responsibility.

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DEFINING WHAT A LEADER IS BIBLICALLY

Philippians 2:3–4 +

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others.

A Leader has to lead for the right reasons, seeking to fill a need when able to do so and looking out for others. In this way we can teach our family what it is like to serve.



CASE STUDIES ON LEADERS & LEADER @ HOME **GOD'S GRACE/MERCY**

Jacob:

- Chosen/Anointed by God
- Genesis BEING It was prophesied that he would rule over his brother before he was born
 - Lied, stole his brother's birth right
 - Tricked his father into giving him inheritance/Blessing
 - Ran away in fear
 - Worked twice as hard for the women he loved/Out tricked by his Uncle.
 - Fought with God and has his hip permeantly disabled
 - Has a whole bunch of family issues, Sons deal in trickery as well
 - Becomes the nation of Israel, God still calls Jacob and his family out of His love and promise for them.

CASE STUDIES ON LEADERS & DUE NUMBERS & DUE NUE NUMBERS & DUE NUMBERS

- Chosen/Anointed by God
 - Led Israel out of Captivity
 - Lost patience and out of anger did things his way instead of how God told him
 - He was restored to God but not allowed to enter into the promised land.

Numbers 20:12 But the LORD said to Moses and Aaron, "Because you did not trust in me enough to honor me as holy in the sight of the Israelites, you will not bring this community into the land I give them."

Numbers 20: 24 "Aaron will be gathered to his people. He will not enter the land I give the Israelites, because both of you rebelled against my command at the waters of Meribah.

King David:

2nd Samuel Chapters 11 and 12

- **BEING A** Loved God
 - **Chosen/Anointed by God**
 - One of the greatest kings of Israel

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- **Committed Adultery, Murdered, Lied**
- **Confronted by Nathan the Prophet**
- **Repented and sought forgiveness**
- Had to deal with consequences but was restored to God, because God loved him.

Romans 12:3–8

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.
