Love our Countryside? Help us improve it.

When I first became Footpath Secretary over eleven years ago for several years we had a separate group of footpath workers that regularly surveyed a random selection of paths. This was a legal requirement through Gwynedd Council to report on the condition of all Public Rights of Way best known as 'Performance indicator Surveys'. Although this came to an end about six years ago the record held on all paths surveyed is still of considerable value. Following this and various other council cuts in expenditure our footpath maintenance team was formed to again work with the Council to ensure our paths are not neglected.

I feel that we can all play a big part in continuing with this aim in mind. If you are not part of our Tim Taclo team perhaps you could consider becoming a footpath worker and just arrange as far as practical to walk the paths in your local area. This could be done at least once a year or preferably more regularly. Record the condition of the paths and report all defects either directly to the Council or myself. If you come across, or your attention is drawn to paths not shown on the OS or definitive map make a note and it could be recorded at Gwynedd Council as a Lost Way. Details of what qualifies as a Lost Way will be the title of an article in the next edition.

Many thanks for your interest, whatever part you play in helping our aims will be so much appreciated.

UPCOMING ERYRI RAMBLERS WALKS

Saturday 9 February - The Menai Bridges. Meet at the bus station in Menai Bridge SH556 720 to catch the 11.36am (not 10.52 as in the walks booklet) Newborough bus. So you can come along early and have a coffee, or slumber in bed for a few more minutes!

Five minutes on the bus takes us to the edge of the Plas Newydd estate, from where a lane leads down to the Menai Strait. An interesting route just above the high water mark takes us to the Nelson statue and the Britannia Bridge. A chance to see the famous

lions before we follow the Wales Coast Path to Church Island, the Belgian Promenade and then Thomas Telford's soaring Menai Bridge.

This is a short easy walk with lots to see and chat about, so expect some dawdling along the way. Ken Chandler, who will be leading the walk if I cannot make it, will be able to tell of the day he climbed up inside one of the Britannia Bridge towers!
