The John Ystumllyn Rose



One of Britain's first known black gardeners has been honoured with a rose named after him in celebration of his life.

John Ystumllyn, whose original name is unknown, was abducted as an eight-year-old boy in west Africa around 1746 and taken to Gwynedd, North Wales. There he became a servant in the household of the Wynn family of Ystumllyn, whose estate he was named after, and learned horticulture in the gardens.

He went on to become a respected gardener and the first black person in the region whose life was well documented, marrying a local white woman, Margaret Gruffydd.

Criccieth now has around 40 of these magnificent roses planted around the town. I am planning a walk which will take in these, his workplace and where he was buried later this month.

- 6] Tim Taclo. Graham kindly briefed us on the next phase of the Gwynedd/Tim Taclo programme. A strategy has been agreed whereby Tim Taclo will be given circular paths to be inspected, agreed with Community Councils, to identify problems and report back on forms for action to be taken, all co-ordinated and directed by Gwynedd officers. Apparently there is funding available for the work to be carried out.
- 7[Finances. We have a healthy bank balance.
- 8] Area Council. I am taking this opportunity to report back on some of the issues raised at the Area Council on 25 June.
- a] Paths to Wellbeing. Whilst the current exploratory programme continues [Penrhyndeudraeth is currently being surveyed] the intention is to expand the programme and could/will include Community Councils in Arfon/Dwyfor.
- b] Angela Charlton, currently Director based in Cardiff, agreed to circulate a paper on the role of Community Councils in maintaining public rights of way. Something we need to better understand the Paths to Wellbeing and perhaps the agenda of Gwynedd.
- c] Walk Classifications . There is confusion in agreeing the most appropriate ways of defining the suitability of walks from easy to very difficult, to be addressed.
- d] Affiliated groups. It was agreed to produce an explanatory note of the status etc of such groups.

One of my favourite walks starts in Parc Menai:

The walk immediately leaves Parc Menai in the direction of Treborth. Walk under the A55 and in approximately 200 metres turn left onto Ffordd Bronwydd.

In about 1km you will arrive under Britannia Bridge and the coastal path. Turn left here and keeping the Menai Straits on your right walk through the woods for 2kms until you reach an elevated platform giving you views over the Straits.

Turn left here and go over the field to the tree line at the top. Look for the kissing gate which leads to the grassy picnic area and car park. Go through the car park and follow the track to the Vaynol Estate farm buildings.

Follow the tarmac road back towards Parc Menai and your starting point.

If you want to add some extra walking have a look around the Parc where there are some superb mature trees and lakes. On this walk, which is about 6 kilometres/4 miles max, grade D there are some great views and I've seen red squirrels, seals, dolphins, a llama, woodpeckers, and lions.

If you fancy an early evening walk I'll happily show you around.
