In this candid conversation, we asked Veteran Wing Commander Jeyakumar ten thought-provoking questions—Dus Sawaal—to understand the values, milestones and mindset behind his remarkable journey. Here's what he shared:

<u>Sqn Ldr AKP</u>: How did your early experiences in the Indian Air Force shape your passion for innovation and later transition into entrepreneurship?

Wg Cdr MJ: I was fortunate to rise through the ranks from being an aircraft technician to an aviator and air defence specialist. This arduous journey posed multiple challenges, propelling me to create innovative solutions. I think those experiences sown the seed of entrepreneurship into my heart.

Sqn Ldr AKP: During your tenure as a Flying Navigator and Commanding Officer, what were some of the toughest challenges you faced and how did those experiences influence your leadership style?



Wg Cdr MJ: Flying, per se, has many inherent challenges where one has to make decisions in split seconds with almost no scope for error and, at times, with very little input. Having been a Commanding Officer (CO) of a Combat Unit and currently being CMD & CEO, I can confidently say that my combat roles gave me the grit to accomplish the mission and to look after my team at the cost of personal growth.

<u>Sqn Ldr AKP</u>: Can you share a memorable experience or breakthrough moment from your indigenous R&D projects, particularly while collaborating with academia and MSMEs?

Wg Cdr MJ: Project POEMS (Pneumatically Operated Electronic Multipurpose Simulator), the greenfield project of the IAF gave me an identity of being a successful Designer cum Project Director wherein I could save 1000s of crores to the exchequer through the collaborative efforts of Academia and MSMEs guided by Air Warriors of the IAF. Inducting such an innovative indigenous project in a record time in a cost-effective manner, was duly recognized by the award of Prime Minister's Certificate of Merit for Excellence in Innovation and personal appreciation by the Honourable President of India in 2017.



Sqn Ldr AKP: What was the inspiration behind the development of the Missile Simulator POEMS, and how do you see it impacting cost-efficiency and safety in defence operations?

Wg Cdr MJ: One of the major challenges faced by me as the Commanding Officer was to train my team which was hampered due to various factors including non-availability of technological know-how and support from the R&D organisations. As the saying goes, when the going gets tough the tough gets going. So, I motivated a team of air warriors, professors of academia and grassroot level MSMEs to indigenously design & develop unique and innovative modules. Being a project managed by the users, we could ensure cost effectiveness and safety of operations.

Sqn Ldr AKP : Your career spans diverse fields—from automation and simulation to advanced technologies like ΑI and thermal sensors. How did you to adapt and manage integrate these varied skills throughout your career?

Wg Cdr MJ: My grooming in the IAF exposed me to multiple fields of specialisation viz aircraft instrumentation, piloting, navigation, aerial photography, nuclear, biological an chemical warfare, defence procurement, administration, event management, HR management, recruitment, aviation safety, air defence operations besides leadership and welfare. This unique array of experience instilled the quest to learn new things besides enabling me to understand, adapt and integrate various technologies and skills at will.

<u>Sqn Ldr AKP</u>: You chose to pursue further education across multiple disciplines after initially dropping out of college. What drove this decision and how has lifelong learning contributed to your entrepreneurial success?

Wg Cdr MJ: An air warrior has no choice but to learn throughout the career and I personally believe that "LiFE = Learning is For Ever". Owing to family compulsions, I had to drop out of college. But, my passion for higher education pushed me towards learning varied subjects including Literature, History, HRM, PRM, Engineering, Behavioural Science, Leadership and Acupuncture. These qualifications have definitely widened my horizon of understanding and honed my entrepreneurial skills.

<u>Sqn Ldr AKP</u>: With your role in BRIDGE Bharat Council promoting collaborative R&D and Coordinated Manufacturing, what do you believe are the essential ingredients for successful partnerships between the military, academia and industry?

Wg Cdr MJ: BRIDGE is an acronym for Binding Researchers, Industries/Institution/Innovators, Defence, Government and Entrepreneurs. As the Founder of this Action-Oriented Think-Tank, I firmly believe and have proven that the concept of Collaborative R&D and Coordinated Manufacturing holds the key to the success of Atmanirbharta.





Sqn Ldr AKP : Through initiatives like LiFE Academy, you are mentoring the next generation. What key advice would you offer to veterans or young professionals looking to transition into the corporate or entrepreneurial world?

Wg Cdr MJ: Being a C2C (Combat to Corporate) professional and first-generation entrepreneur cum mentor to many startups/MSMEs I can only say that except for the modern jargons and a bit of financial management veterans have everything. While the young professionals have the agility to manage technologies, they need to seek the guidance of domain experts to hone their entrepreneurial skills

<u>Sqn Ldr AKP</u>: Looking back at your remarkable journey from the Indian Air Force to founding multiple startups, what are the most important lessons in resilience and leadership that you would like to share with our readers?

Wg Cdr MJ:

- · Never Shy Away; It Is Better to Fail Than to Run
- · Take Failures as Stepping Stones
- · Wait Not Create Opportunities
- · Compete with the Best but Never Ape or Mock
- · Be Abreast with Latest Technologies but Always Master Human Technology

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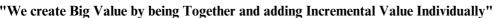
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A few weeks ago, as I sipped my morning coffee, my phone buzzed with a flurry of messages. "Markets are crashing again!" said one. "Should I pull out my investments?" asked another. "This Trump Tariff—what does it even mean for us?" questioned yet another voice of concern.

Os 1 scholled through these messages, 1 was reminded of a quote by warren Buffett: 7 "The stock market is a device for transferring money from the impatient to the patient."

Yes, markets have been choppy—more volatile than a teenager's mood during exam time. The benchmark indices are down nearly 10% from their peak, and some individual stocks have taken a beating of 40–50%. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs), who once poured money into our markets like wedding guests pouring blessings on a newlywed couple, have now turned net sellers. Add to that the drama of the "Trump Tariff" — an unexpected twist that's made global investors jittery and domestic businesses a little uneasy.

But before we dive into gloom, let's pause and take stock (pun intended).

Why Are the Markets Behaving This Way?

Markets, like weather, go through seasons. After a long spell of sunshine and rally, a little thunder was always due. The recent correction is less of a collapse and more of a reset—a reminder that trees don't grow to the sky. Here's what's in the mix:



<u>Global Uncertainty</u>: The US tariffs have added a layer of unpredictability to global trade flows, and markets hate uncertainty.

After a prolonged bull run, it's natural for foreign investors to book profits and re-balance portfolios. Even small domestic investors do book occasional profit, only that their profit booking does not impact the overall market conditions.





Domestic Concerns

Inflation, interest rates, and earnings estimates have also played their part in dampening market sentiment.

But does this mean we should panic?

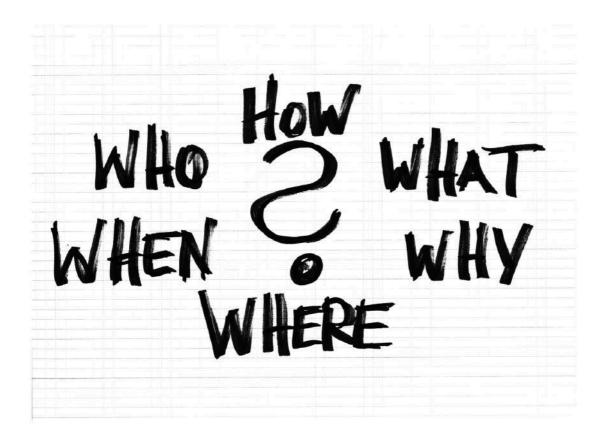
Zoom Out, Don't Freak Out Here's where I often ask my clients to zoom out.

Remember March 2020? When markets fell over 30% in weeks due to the pandemic? Investors who stayed calm and continued their SIPs not only recovered losses but saw spectacular gains in the next 18–24 months.

Or as the legendary investor Peter Lynch puts it: "Far more money has been lost by investors preparing for corrections, or trying to anticipate corrections, than has been lost in the corrections themselves."

If you recall, your investment plan was for long term. You came investing in the market with an aim of earning 12-15% average return over a long period of time. You had started an SIP as your child is young and you will need a lump sum amount for his education or marriage 10-15 years from now. Your plan to buy a house or retirement for which you are investing in mutual funds is still some years away then why panic. Remember, the real loss is when you exit the market. The Markets have always rewarded discipline and punished panic.

So, What Should You Do Now?







STICK TO YOUR GOALS:

Your investments are not for the next news cycle, but for your child's education, your retirement, your dreams. Let your why guide your what.

DON'T TIME THE MARKET, SPEND TIME IN THE MARKET:

It's tempting to exit now and wait for "better times", but as history shows, the best days often come right after the worst ones.

DIVERSIFY SMARTLY:

Use this opportunity to re-balance your portfolio. Quality stocks are available at discount prices — it's like a festival sale, but for wealth creation!





SIP. SLEEP. REPEAT

Continue your Systematic Investment Plans. Markets may test your patience, but they always reward consistency.

A FINAL WORD: STAY CALM AND LAUGH A LITTLE

I recently came across this quote that made me chuckle: > "If stock market experts were so expert, they would be buying stocks, not selling advice."

Jokes aside, in times like these, expert guidance does matter, but more than that, your own temperament matters. The best portfolio in the world can't save an investor who reacts emotionally. And an average portfolio can work wonders if backed by patience, discipline, and long-term vision.

It was the early 1990s. I had just received my commission and was undergoing my mandatory infantry attachment with the 2nd Battalion of 4th Gorkha Rifles. The unit was stationed in the high-altitude Kargil Valley, deployed along the Line of Control, and tasked with protecting the Indian border with Pakistan. As I held a master's degree in animal science, the Commanding Officer decided to utilize my expertise in poultry farming for a welfare project within the battalion area. The project was conceived to address a specific issue: troops, fond of "Rakshi" (rum) and "Mass" (meat), would often purchase chicken at exorbitant prices, draining their savings. The Commanding Officer recognized this financial burden on the jawans and summoned me to prepare a project report on poultry farming.

Preparing the project report was straightforward, but implementing it in a resource-scarce location like Kargil proved to be a monumental task. Nevertheless, I compiled the report, outlining the necessary resources, costs, and projected outcomes, including production results after six weeks, sale rates, and profits.

The report was routed through the second-in-command to the Commanding Officer. He summoned me to discuss the report, having circled the profit section with a red pen. His face was equally red as he questioned me, "Are we merchants looking to profit from our jawans?" I understood my mistake and felt apologetic.

After obtaining the Commanding Officer's approval, I began gathering resources. I contacted the local animal husbandry department, and their officers kindly provided feeding troughs and water troughs. Since we aimed to raise broiler chickens for meat, I opted for a deep litter system. I sourced sawdust from a local sawmill and obtained transparent sheets from the engineering regiment to cover the poultry shed's roof, allowing sufficient light to enter. The shed was constructed from mud and stone, and I installed Bukharis (oil heaters) to maintain a warm environment. Feed provisions were also made

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The final requirement was to obtain one-day-old chicks, for which I wrote a DO letter to the Commandant of the Field Research Laboratory at Leh.



The Field Research Laboratory (FRL) was established in 1962 at Leh, Ladakh, as envisioned by India's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru. The laboratory's primary objective was to make the harsh terrain of Ladakh's cold, arid desert more hospitable and provide fresh food to troops deployed in the region. Through its groundbreaking research and development efforts, the institute has significantly improved agriculture, animal husbandry, and the local flora. Over time, the laboratory's vision, mission, and mandate have evolved.

We received a communication from the Commandant of FRL to collect one-day- old chicks. However, it took another two weeks to arrange a vehicle, obtain permission for the outstation trip from Brigade Headquarters, and complete other formalities. Finally, I set off with my Sahayak, driver, and coduce in a three-ton jumbo vehicle to Leh, which was over 200 kilometers away. The journey took around 10 hours on treacherous roads.

Upon arrival, we were warmly received, as they were expecting us. The next year spent completing payment formalities and obtaining a road pass. On third day, we received the chicks, but to my surprise, they had already grown to three weeks old. They were packed into cardboard cartons.

During my visit, I befriended the Veterinary Officer at FRL, who educated me on botential diseases that could affect the chicks and the preventive medications available. He also provided me with some medication and poultry feed.

We began our journey back to Kargil, but after two hours, I decided to check the chicks. I ordered the driver to stop the vehicle, and upon inspecting the art ans, I found that several chicks had already died, and a few were on the very e of death. It was a distressing situation, as I realized that by the time we are ved in Kargil, the entire batch of chicks would likely perish.

the conscious decision to return to FRL in Leh rather than risking the loss of the entire consignment. The problem was due to congestion among the overgrown chicks. We returned to FRL Leh and met with the Commandant, explaining the situation to him. He kindly accepted the return of the chicks, including those that had died. Since a new stock of one-day-old chicks was expected to arrive in a few days, the Commandant suggested that I stay back and collect the fresh batch.









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Itollowed his advice and eventually returned to Kargil with the new, one-day-old chicks, which arrived safely and in good health. We unloaded the cheerful chicks into the specially designed shed, freeing them from their cartons and providing an open environment. To my delight, they appeared happy and energetic, showing no signs of fatigue from their journey. They began pecking at the feed in the feeding troughs and drinking water from the water troughs. A generator set provided round-the-clock lighting for the chicks. I had trained personnel to ensure a constant supply of feed and water, while my task was to monitor their activity.

Just as things were progressing smoothly, I received notification that my annual leave of one month had been sanctioned, and I proceeded to leave. I handed over the responsibility to another lieutenant in the battalion, providing detailed notes on the project's status.

Sport my return, I found that the poultry birds had grown and were ready for consumption. They were distributed to various posts and piquets on the Line of Control, and a few were slaughtered for the Divisional Commander's lunch at the officers mess. The Army's commitment to the welfare of its personnel was evident, even in the challenging high-altitude terrain where fresh food was scarce and tinned food was the norm. The General Officer Commanding (GOC) was pleasantly surprised to have tender chicken for lunch, and I received accolades from all for my efforts.

The poultry farming project was a remarkable welfare initiative that brought numerous benefits to the troops stationed in the high-altitude terrain of Kargil. By providing a steady supply of fresh and nutritious meat, the project improved the overall health and well-being of the personnel. Additionally, the project helped to boost morale and served as a welcome respite from the challenges of serving in a remote and inhospitable region.

The success of the project was a testament to the Army's commitment to the welfare of its personnel and its ability to innovate and adapt to challenging environments.



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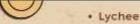

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1. I was posted in Tenga valley on one faithful day in 2009 Monsoons Whole knight it was continuously raining heavily, Next day morning when we saw the rain water was gushing from mountains around us.

As I was responsible for maintaining essential Engineer services in Military station. I quickly dressed up and called for my Gypsy, the Driver arrived I asked him to handover the starring to me, Initially started driving down towards transit camp and found water from Tenga river was over flowing started entering the barracks on lower side of transit camp, people vacated the area and reached higher places then I drove towards Military hospital and checked the DG sets were working and sufficient fuel was in stock, then could not go further as water level on road was raising.

I quickly came back to unit and inform HQ not to send any vehicle and men outside the unit lines, The Subaidar major informed me that one vehicle has gone to butchery to get the fresh supply. Sensing the danger I quickly drove my Gypsy towards butchery enroot one of the Jawan of other unit informed me that our unit vehicle has fallen down from mountain.

Without wasting time reached the site of incident and where our Tata Mobile has slide down the hill I immediately asked my driver to keep an eye on shooting stones from hill started slowly getting down the hill I could find the vehicle but could not find anybody in it, claimed back up hill reached main road I found one JCO, he informed me that they recovered one officer and JCO and sent them to Military hospital and they could not trace the driver, once again along with others we started searching the driver we found him his head was sheared, by shooting stone splitting the roof of vehicle and sheared his head living him dead on the spot. We shifted him to Military hospital for further course of action.

2. I was only officer available in the unit, as my Garrison Engineer had gone to Tezpur to attend the conference and other officer was on leave one more officer was injured and hospitalized. I with help of other JCO 's could manage the unit and kept in check.

The message was conveyed to his wife, "she was in family way and three 3. months pregnant" she was brought to Military hospital, where her husband's remains were kept, we were informed the Station Head quarter about the incident and were trying manage helicopter from Indian Air force to airlift his remains due to low clouds and bad weather the Air force was not able to get in the valley, mean while in evening I learnt the Jawans wife who was pregnant hand not eaten anything I was worried about the child in her womb. other Ladies failed to make her eat or drink, Mean while lady Medical officer told me make her eat something, I tried to make her eat she refused, I had no other go than holding her hair and forced her to gate some fruit juice. She then said crying loudly kindly arrange some kersin or petrol pour on remains of my husband's remains and me at least our last rights can be done together. As already it was second day. Her words touched me I controlled my emotions and told her, will promise you by tomorrow evening you will reach home with him.

I don't know how to proceed the station commander organized the Wreath laying on that day afternoon then told me tomorrow if weather is clear we will tie up for Airlift

- 4. Considering the condition of entire valley being cut off from rest of the world due to flash floods and many landslides ,roads and bridges being washed off. I spoke to one of the senior officer in Indian Air force through my contacts, seeking to help us evacuate his remains. One of the Wng Cdr (Pilot) spoke to me from Indian Air force and said the Valley is narrow and full of clouds covering all the peaks, we will try once the weather is clear also said Metro man is not showing any clear weather.
- Anticipating the delay due to weather I called one of my local contractor asked him to provide me two Vehicles tata somo or Bolero with my trusted local drivers to carry the remains. Two vehicles arrived at 0230 hrs I explained them the task, mean while I requested BRTF Cdr to help me by deploying his men in case needed as he had several Dets enroot. He assured me he will do the needful. at about 300hrs I along with one of my JCO, deceased Jawan's wife and two drivers commenced the journey to Guwahati in Assam by passing all the authorities in station.
- 6. In pitch Dark on the way near Col Moad we encounter herd of wild Gaur, we switched off our vehicles lights and waited till they move out of our way, after some time they moved out, the local driver said



it is said to be a good omen for them. Further short of point Zero, we found huge boulders slided and laying on road blocking the way, we came back about 3 Kms approached the labor camp of BRTF they came with some labor and cleared our way after we reached Sesa point we were stopped by Military police and said there is landslide ahead, we said we will manage and proceeded further when we reach the land slide location we found some way to exit, by doing so our vehicle got stuck in slush of the slide, I took the staring from my driver brought in all my driving skills and maneuvered the vehicle out from slush.

7. We managed and reached the Tippi bridge, there were many civil and tourist vehicles standard there, I met Officer in charge DET of BRTF of that area standing there waiting for our arrival. we greeted each other, He gave me first hand information over a cup of tea from the flask about washing off abetment of Tippi Bridge, then we walked to the bridge and inspected the possibility to cross over, It was really disappointing to see helplessness to cross over against the nature. Suddenly I noticed about five of the BRTF labor were crossing over to bridge, by walking over an ISMC 300 Iron Channel, I immediately checked with my driver the dead weight of vehicle did some load calculations and asked the officer to organize one more guarder like that one.

It took about twenty mints guarder was brought to site, we laid it safely and asked people get down from vehicle and took staring and slowly crossed over the guarder on to the bridge successfully, then second vehicle also was moved, by that time it was dawn, we thanked the officer and moved further, and made call to flight cdr in Indian Air force and gave them information that we have reached with remains of the Jawan to Tippi as there were low clouds requested him join us at Solmara Air base, which was an hour drive from there we reached Solmara Air base, by that time the Chopper flown in we boarded the chopper flue over Great river Brahmaputra and reached Guwahati in about forty mints.

We booked the remains in Indian Air lines to Delhi as here were no direct flight to Kanpur, we spontaneously re organized the move and booked ticket for the lady and JCO escort the remains, informed Sub area Delhi extend help at New Delhi airport. The sub area organized receive and give state honor at the Delhi Airport, then the issue came the Kanpur based only Aircraft was of ATR type which cannot hold coffin in. we decided that the JCO will take the remains by road from Delhi to his village at Kanpur, also the second issue was the Kanpur flight timing it was schedule to depart twenty mints before arrival of flight from Guwahati.

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- 8. I got stuck don't know what to do, It appeared all doors were being closed, then I prayed almighty standing on road side near Airport, I received a call from one of my friend from Bangalore she was working in Jet Airways, she asked where are you, I explained her the situation I am in . she said don't worry let me see how best I can help you, dropped the call. In few mints she called back and said don't worry I have tied up Air India at Delhi airport they will receive the lady from Guwahati flight and board her in Kanpur Flight They will not take off the aircraft till she is boarded the Kanpur aircraft. It was grate relief for me accordingly I briefed the JCO the next course of action and boarded the Aircraft further informed the Sub area New Delhi about the development.
- 9. They landed at Delhi the Kanpur bound Air craft was standard for her she was picked up from Guwahati Aircraft as it landed at Delhi terminal and shifted her to Kanpur Flight, by seven she reached the Kanpur, The Station manager at Kanpur received her and escorted her up to her village in his staff car that evening, finally she reached her home by evening as I had promised her. This is what you got to believe "Shidath se agar Koshish kare tho poori Kainath jud jathi hai thume wos mokam thak paunchane ke liye"
- 10. Here at Delhi Airport the Coffin was received with full state honor and sent by road to Kanpur the JCO escorted the remains and reached his village by Dawn . There family members and village men received him and prepared for his final adobe the state police gave state honor and finally he was laid to rest in peace.
- 11. The loss for family and the unit cannot be made good; as he was the most dedicated Jawan we have come across.
- 12. The conditions to shift his remains to his village from the Tenga Valley was next to impossible, but the words his wife said to me to arrange some fuel to burn remains made me tell her that by tomorrow evening you will be reaching home with him came true.
- 13. After this incidence where ever I went in the station, I was respected a lot offices and men, even some I met in other Military stations they come and shock hand and remind me the incident of how I managed to reach them home.
- 14. I thank Almighty for listing to my prayers and made them reach home.
- 15. Brother hood and solidarity this is what we live with and earn in INDIAN ARMY

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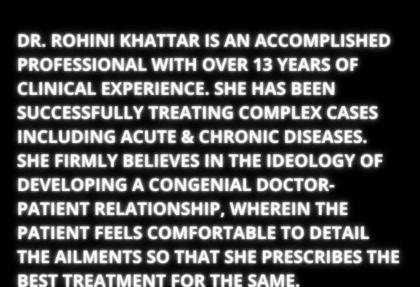

Better bonding



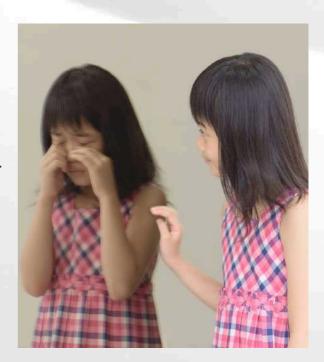

Goodbye stress and fights

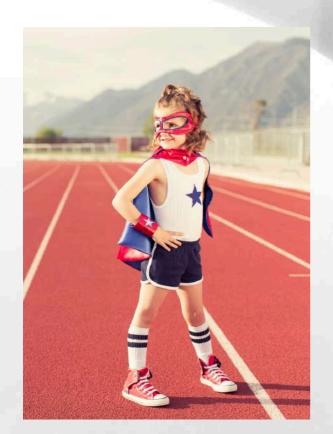

Now: Text messages and video calls have made communication instant but impersonal. The charm of handwritten words and the excitement of receiving a letter have been lost in the age of instant replies.

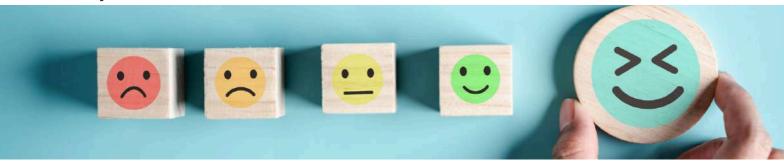




Mental Health and Lifestyle Changes

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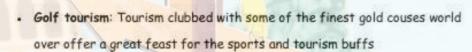


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
