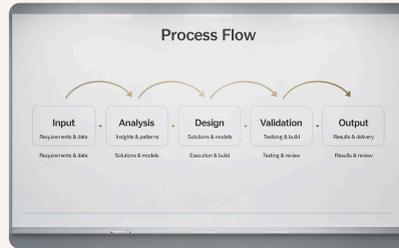
What the Diagnostic Evaluates

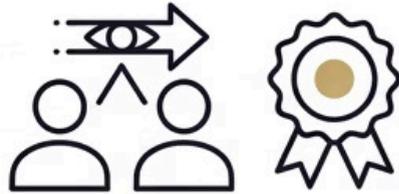

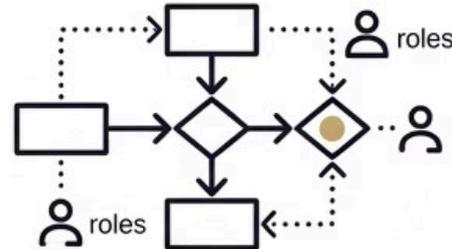
What We Analyze During the Diagnostic

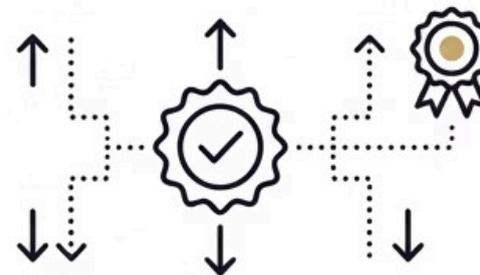

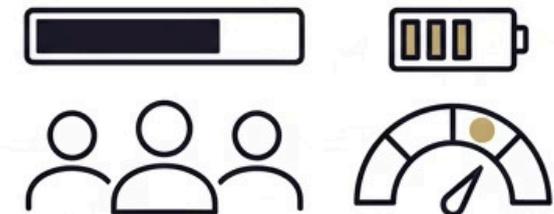
