<u>Advisory on Stepped Up Enforcement Checks on Safe Management Measures (SMMs)</u> at Food and Beverage Premises

- 1. With the upcoming festive period and start of Phase 3 of re-opening from 28 December 2020, government agencies will be stepping up enforcement checks to ensure that F&B operators, premises owners and patrons comply with Safe Management Measures (SMMs).
- 2. The stepped-up enforcement checks are necessary to mitigate the virus spread and continue to keep the community transmission low in Singapore amidst the further re-opening of activities, such as the increase in group size from 5 to 8 persons and increase in capacity limits of certain premises. F&B premises are reminded that the current group size limit of 5 persons will apply until Phase 3 takes effect on 28 December.
- 3. F&B premises that are in operation must implement SMMs as required by the Ministry of Manpower (MOM) and comply with the Covid-19 (Temporary Measures) (Control Order) Regulations.
- 4. In addition, F&B premises are required to comply with the measures set out by Enterprise Singapore (ESG), Housing & Development Board (HDB), Singapore Food Agency (SFA), Singapore Tourism Board (STB) and Urban Redevelopment Authority (URA) in the joint "Advisory for Phase 2 Re-opening of Food & Beverage Establishments".
- 5. We would like to remind F&B operators and premises owners that failure to comply with SMMs is a serious offence. We will not hesitate to take strict enforcement action against any breaches, including temporary closure of premises and the issuance of fines.
