Any violation of these rules and regulations may result in disciplinary action such as fines, suspension, or termination of membership.

1. Follow the four rules of gun safety:
 - a. Treat all firearms as if they are always loaded.
 - b. Never point the muzzle at something you are not willing to destroy.
 - c. Keep your finger off the trigger until you are on target and have made the decision to shoot.
 - d. Know your target and what is beyond it.
2. Members must have **all** their guests fill out and sign a Waiver of Liability Form and pay a fee of \$10.00 **before** the guest can enter the range. Guest passes are good for the day of issuance only. A signed Waiver of Liability Form and guest fee is required for each visit.
3. Guests are not allowed within the range area without the member. The member must directly supervise all guests.
4. If you bring it with you, you must take it with you or dispose of trash in provided trash receptacles. Pick up ammunition shells and cases. These can be placed in containers under shooting benches.
5. Members and guests must leave the premises if told to do so by a board member or range safety officer. Range Safety Officers are identified with a membership badge containing... Failure to leave shall constitute criminal trespass and shall be prosecuted. If you witness a rule violation or other unsafe conduct, you can report it by calling...
6. Ammunition can only be fired on the gun range between the hours of 9:00 am to 8:00 pm or sunset, whichever is soonest.

7. Firearms must be unloaded and holstered, cased, or have an empty chamber indicator installed when not on the firing line and when anyone is down range.
8. Anyone can call a cease-fire if they have a safety concern. Everyone who hears someone call "Cease Fire" should repeat it loudly, so everyone hears it. A cease-fire command and repeating of command applies to all occupants of the range regardless of what bay they are in. Once the safety concern is resolved, the person who called the cease fire or a Range Safety Officer will announce that range activities can begin again.
9. If you did not bring it, or buy it in the club house, you can't shoot at it.
10. Shooting from beyond the furthest designated firing position on any range is prohibited.
11. Targets must be placed within 6 feet of the base of the berm. The top of the target cannot be higher than 6 feet from the ground. The top of the target cannot be higher than 4 feet from the ground when shooting high powered rifles on the short ranges.

Any violation of these rules and regulations may result in disciplinary action such as fines, suspension, or termination of membership.

1. Archery range is for archery ONLY. The discharging of firearms is prohibited in the archery range and will result in loss of membership.
2. Arrows are to be shot at club provide targets or commercially manufactured targets designed for archery use.
3. Targets are to be placed within the area of club provided targets.
4. Bows are to be shot from designated firing lines ONLY.
5. No shooting or nocking of arrows is allowed while anyone is down range.

6. No shooting across archery lanes is allowed. Only shoot at the target in your lane.
7. Broadhead arrows are prohibited. Field points ONLY.
