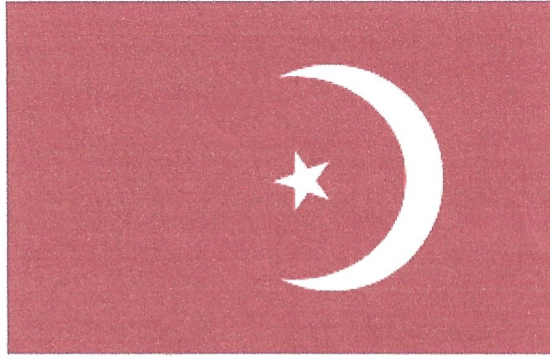
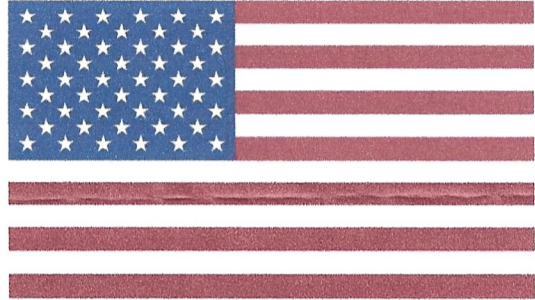
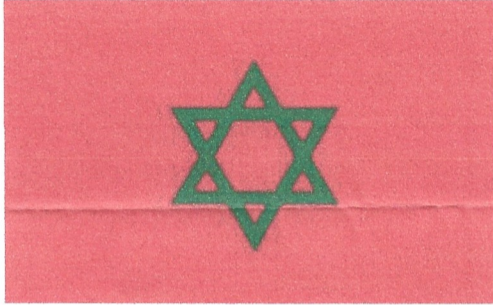

WHEREAS,

The Mother of Bishop John Jamison Moor, Fannie Riedoubt, was born “a free woman” (a Moor) but was kidnapped at age 15 and enslaved against her open will. She had children while enslaved and ran away with them for freedom. She was caught, some of her children were sold as a punishment, but yet she ran for freedom once again. She was successful in her second attempt, carrying with her baby, Benjamin. Benjamin later became Bishop John Jamison Moore, 15th consecrated Bishop of the A.M.E. Zion Church.

WHEREAS,

Bishop John Jamison Moor (approx. 1804- December 9,1893) was inspired by the Holy Spirit in 1833 in Harrisonburg, Pennsylvania when he “yielded” to the spirit and took up “preaching” as an occupation. He hired tutors in Greek, English, and Hebrew and began to practice his newfound career. He preached the gospel for over 50 years, travelled the united states and to various parts of the world doing the work of God, including: Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, California, North Carolina, British Columbia Canada, and England.

WHEREAS,

Bishop Moore lived a life of heroic virtue, as a missionary, an itinerant/ circuit rider preacher, until being elevated to the dignified title of “Bishop”, of the AME Zion Church in 1868. With the support of the board of Bishops, Bishop Moore published the *History of the AME Zion Church in America in 1884*, documenting the way to establish an independent ecclesiastical government. The book was published in the Library of Congress, by an act of Congress.

WHEREAS,

After ordaining a church for orphans and widows in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and serving as a trustee of a home for orphans and widows in North Carolina, the grandson of Bishop Moore was orphaned at a young age when both his mother and father died. His name was Isaiah Henry Harrison Moore, and he later became a child preacher baptizing his best friend at the age of 9. Isiah Moore went on to become Dr. Moore and a Dean of the College of Scriptures Bible College in Louisville, Kentucky. He also founded churches in Kentucky, Ohio, Indiana, Missouri, and Arkansas, for the Church of Christ/ Disciples of Christ

Denomination. Rev Dr. Isaiah Moore continued a legacy and dynasty of Moorish American clerics, continuing to this very day.

WHEREAS,

Bishop John Jamison Moor was a “Crypto-Jew”, a secret Israelite, a Hebrew that hid the Judaic faith of his mother in secret due to the oppression of the Spanish and Catholic Inquisition. In 2019 the United States of America recognized and documented that “African-Americans” had been brought as slaves to the shores of America and have been here for 400 years (House Resolution- HR1242).

WHEREAS,

On November 12th, 2019, 144 years later, John Jamison Moore’s grandson (H.A. Jabar OdoKhan-El) redeemed, reclaimed, and reestablished the church ordained by Bishop Moore in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and announced at the 168th anniversary commemoration of First Church AME Zion San Francisco, the fulfillment of the 400-year Abrahamic prophecy.

WHEREAS,

On September 20, 2020 (under the leadership of Rev. Sharon Cheek) grandson of Bishop Moor said, during the benediction of the 168th anniversary of the AME Zion “First Church” San Francisco:

“So, family, I think I've done what I have to do. I'm going to leave you with these words. It is by me and through me, the power of the Holy Spirit the Lord

whereas Bishop John Jamison Moore was touched by the Holy Spirit, the Lord. Where Bishop John Jamison Moore's mother Fannie Riedoubt was kidnapped and taken from her history, heritage, and her culture of Isra-EL. It is whereas Bishop John Jamison Moore raised up and did the work of Jesus the resurrected Christ to give you a church, to give you a home and a nation. It is by the power in me, the Holy Spirit, the Lord, to consecrate Bishop John Jamison Moore as Saint Benyamin the Moor. On this day, let it be recognized as a legal opinion and authority that Bishop John Jamison Moore, son of Fannie Riedoubt and John Moore, is no longer simply John Jamison Moore.

On this day of September 20, 2020, Bishop John Jamison Moore, born Benjamin is this day “Saint Benyamin the Moor.”

NOW THEREFORE, I, Yahashua Bin Ervin Don Shabazz Isra-EL, Premier of the Zionst Temple of the Ecclesiastical Association, the Zion Church of the Evangelical Association, the Kingdom of Shabazz do hereby proclaim that Bishop John Jamison Moore, originally named Benjamin by birth, be known as Saint Benyamin the Moor and be venerated (not worshipped) by the laity as an ancestor angel and venerable father of the Zion Church of the Evangelical Association, the Zionst Temple of 1875, the Kingdom of Shabazz.
