Homeplay 2 - The Living Oracle

We now have the understanding that each of us is a living, breathing oracle. We also understand that when we recognize a pattern within ourselves, it can bring us to an epiphany, and acting on that epiphany creates a new pattern.

In this exercise you are invited to act on your epiphany while simultaneously acting as an oracle for others. You will be creating an oracle message that will become part of a sacred reflection of our collective wisdom.

This exercise has 2 components, the journal part and the oracle part.

Let's start with journaling:

- Think about your time spent here in Oracle School.
- Choose one epiphany that you had when you recognized a pattern.
- Think about the significant event that caused this pattern and how it has, up until now, influenced your thoughts, feelings, and beliefs.
- Now that you have recognized this and had an epiphany, how has your perception of your past changed?
- What ideas about yourself have shifted in your story in motion as a result?
- What are the lessons/pearls this story holds for you now?

Creating your Oracle:

Once you have journaled, it's time to create your oracle.

Consider:

• If this pearl were an oracle message that you could share with others, what would the message be? What would this "oracle card" say?



- Your message will be an oracle for whoever Spirit leads to it, so don't include any personal information, stories, or names.
- Your message should stay in the solution.
- Oracles remind us that we are supported.
- Your message should not be more than 1 or 2 short paragraphs.

After you have written out your oracle message, create or find an artistic expression for it.

You can:

- Draw
- Paint
- Create a short poem
- Use your own photography
- Or find artwork or a picture online that you feel expresses your oracle

You will be invited to add your oracle to the Facebook classroom in our Living Oracle Thread. This Living Oracle will become one more member of your oracle council.
