Introduction to the Collection

Village Grove is a fabulous, one-of-a-kind community! Although the homes consist of different plans, styles and exterior elevations- one thing has the ability to make them look and feel like a cohesive collection... and that is color!

When homeowners are intentional with their exterior paint selections, the result is not only functional (in terms of maintenance), but highly beneficial in terms of home value.

When COMMUNITIES are intentional with their exterior paint selections- the result is even more dramatic and successful!

We have created a custom color collection for Village Grove that is designed to allow each home to stand out individually, while ensuring that the community altogether remains 'aesthetically pleasing' and 'design relevant' in order to gain maximum value for all.

Our goal is to break the process down into steps that you can accomplish on your own (with effort!), but to also be available if you get stuck or need help bringing your 'vision' to life!



How to start building a Color Palette

Gather your information: • Take exterior photos of your home from all sides and study them. • Pay attention to your immediate neighbor's homes and take those into consideration.

• Look at your landscaping and determine the amount of "green" that will accompany your home's overall look. • Take close-ups of any existing natural/structural elements (stone, brick, roof, wood, etc) and include those when you first start to 'pull colors'. *Bold colored brick (red, pink, etc.) should be considered an actual color that is already in your palette!

Research + **define your goal**: • Look online/in magazines at home exteriors. Save *anything* you like for future reference.

• Write down what you want people to think about when they pass your home- what do you want it to say about you? How do you want it to make you feel? • What do you NOT like? What are your concerns? • Use all of these things as "guidelines" to help you narrow down color selections. Without a predetermined defined goal- you won't be grounded in your "decisions" and it will make it harder to choose!

• Go to a local Sherwin Williams (or ANY paint vendor) and get samples or 'paint cards' and sit with them for a few days. • Look at any color(s) you're considering against any existing elements that will remain (stone, brick, etc) during several times of the day to see how much sun hits certain areas! Shade versus direct sunlight makes a big difference!

Color Strategies + Tips

Does your home have brick or stone??

Decide if that will remain in its original state or not. That will be the most "obvious" change, so you'll want to start there!

Is there a color you really love? Is it dark/light? Bold/neutral?

Cool/warm? Determine it's characteristics and find

complimentary ones to that.

A good palette should have at least 4 colors: A main neutral, a dark, a light, and an accent (usually either warm or cool depending on what the rest of the palette is lacking).

The more detail your house has- the more "custom" your color application can be! Don't forget less obvious places like porch ceilings, window grids, etc. for a place to put "bolder" color!


If starting from scratch:

- Choose a main color (this will be the most visually 'obvious' color overall). *For siding only or siding AND brick/stone.
 - Decide if you want your trim to compliment, define or contrast that main color, then select a trim option.
- If you have brick/stone- choose an accent color that pulls from one of those tones. If you don't- select an accent color in a medium shade of something natural on/around your house.
 - Finally– use bold tones for small details (gutters, shutters, front door, etc). *Bold tones can be "colorful" or "deep".

Limewash: Information + Tips


Great for: brick, stone

STYLES IT ENHANCES: EUROPEAN, ARCHITECTURAL, TRADITIONAL, COASTAL, MODERN CRAFTSMAN, TRANSITIONAL



A wash-away coverage that is completely customizable to you and your home. However, that means you need to be very clear with your contractor about which application of limewash you're hoping to achieve!

THERE ARE STYLES THAT HAVE A MORE NATURAL, WORN LOOK. THERE ARE STYLES WITH A MORE "SPECKLED" LOOK. THERE ARE STYLES WITH SPECIFIC ACCENT AREAS THAT ARE WASHED AWAY! PAY ATTENTION TO THE REST OF YOUR HOME'S "CHARACTER" AND CONSIDER THE ACCENTS YOU'D LIKE TO USE, THEN SEE WHICH KIND WOULD LOOK BEST!

Great for: stucco, brick, stone




Solid color that transforms dated brick/stone, yet still allows the texture and pattern to be featured.

FLAT PAINTED MASONRY DOESN'T HAVE TO BE AN "ALL-OR-NOTHING" APPLICATION. THERE ARE WAYS TO LEAVE SPECIFIC AREAS OF ORIGINAL BRICK/STONE EXPOSED, IF PREFERRED!

FROM SMALL WINDOW ACCENTS TO ENTIRE SIDES- IF YOU'RE WORRIED ABOUT LOSING ALL YOUR BRICK-DON'T BE! IT CAN ABSOLUTELY BE INCORPORATED INTO YOUR NEW LOOK!


