

Furthermore, he received the MERIT Award for the Bay Area Piano Competition (2024) and the Director's Award for his role as the pianist for the Moreland Symphonic Orchestra's Beethoven Triple Concerto in C Major (2023). She performed at the Atlanta Young Artist Concert with the Nova Trio which also received 3rd place at the Franklin Pond Chamber Music Competition. The chamber team has since evolved into the Nova Piano Quartet, where she continues to perform and further her studies in chamber music. Additionally, Katie serves as a pianist for the Narae Band at her church. Passionate about using music to make a difference. Katie and her musical friends organized the Sounds of Support benefit concert, successfully raising funds in June 2023. Excited for a return appearance at this event in January 2025, she continues to inspire others through her performances and dedication to the arts.
