San Marcos is a city and the county seat of Hays County, Texas, United States. The city is a part of the Greater Austin Metropolitan Area. San Marcos's limits extend into Caldwell and Guadalupe counties, as well. San Marcos is on the Interstate 35 corridor between Austin and San Antonio. Its population was 44,894 at the 2010 census and 67,553 at the 2020 census. Founded on the banks of the San Marcos River, the area is thought to be among the oldest continuously inhabited sites in the Americas. San Marcos is home to Texas State University and the Meadows Center for Water and the Environment.

# San Marcos River

The San Marcos River is spring-fed which begins in San Marcos at The Meadows Center. Since the river is spring-fed and begins in San Marcos, the water is clear which allows you to view to the bottom of the river. The water is a constant 72 degrees year round. There are three drops/falls at Rio Vista Park; this area is called Rio Vista Falls. If you do not wish to go over the falls, exit the river to the left of the falls. Due to the natural environment, the volume of water, depth and debris can change from day to day.

# **Regional Parks**

#### **Bicentennial Park**

Located at 209 S. CM Allen Parkway. The park is 4 acres and the amenities include Picnic Tables, Hike/Bike Trails, BBQ Grills and Trash Cans.

#### City Park

Located at 170 Charles Austin Dr. The park is 18 acres and the amenities include a Playground, Basketball Court, Hike/Bike Trails, Picnic Tables, BBQ Grills, Benches and Trash Cans. The City Park Recreation Hall is available for rental, for information on fees and availability call 512-393-8400.

#### Children's Park

Located at 205 S. CM Allen Parkway. The park is 7 acres and the amenities include Restrooms, Playground, Pavilion, Picnic Tables, Benches, Water Fountain, BBQ Grills and Trash Cans.

#### Dog Park

Located at 250 Charles Austin Dr. The park is 2 acres and the amenities include a Covered Shade Area, Picnic Tables, Benches, Water Tub, Water Fountain, Pett Mit Dispenser, Scoops, and Trash Cans.

#### Five Mile Dam Park

#### **Gary Sports Complex**

Located at 2600 Airport HWY 21. The park is 42 acres and the amenities include Restrooms, Adult/Youth Softball Fields, Picnic Tables, Water Fountain and Trash Cans.

#### **Lancaster Park**

Located at 2108 Lancaster St. The park is 1 acre.

#### Ramon Lucio Park

Located at 601 S. CM Allen Parkway. The park is 22 acres and the amenities include Baseball/Softball Fields (under direction of SMYBSA) Restrooms, Hike/Bike Trails, Picnic Tables, BBQ Grill, Benches, Trash Cans and a Pavilion.

#### Rio Vista Park

Located at 555 Cheatham St. at the corner of Cheatham St. and CM Allen Parkway. The park is 14 acres and the amenities include Restrooms, Tennis Courts, 1/2 Basketball Court, Picnic Tables, BBQ Grills, Benches, a Pavilion, City Swimming Pool, Hike/Bike Trails and Trash Cans.

#### San Marcos Plaza Park

Located at 201 N. CM Allen Parkway on the corner of CM Allen Parkway and Hopkins St. The park is 5.1 acres and the amenities include Hike/Bike Trails, Benches, Wooden Deck, Large Stage (available for special events), Trash Cans and The Fish Hatchery Building (available for rental), for information on fees and availability contact 512-393-8400.

#### San Marcos Wildlife Habitat

Located at 700 Cheatham St. The park is 10 acres and the amenities include Restrooms, Hike/Bike Trails, Benches, Trash Cans, Picnic Tables and BBQ Grills.

#### Skate Park

#### **About Texas State**

Authorized by the Texas Legislature in 1899, Southwest Texas State Normal School opened its doors in 1903. Over the years, the Legislature broadened the institution's scope and changed its name, in succession, to Southwest Texas State Normal College, Southwest Texas State Teachers College, Southwest Texas State College, Southwest Texas State University, and in 2003 to Texas State University. Each name reflects the university's growth from a small teacher preparation institution to a major, multipurpose university. Texas State's original mission was to prepare Texas public school teachers. It became renowned for carrying out this mission, but today it does far more.

# The San Marcos Campus

Completed in 1903, the red-roofed, castle-like landmark called Old Main was Texas State's first building.


As the university's student population has grown – from 303 in 1903 to 35,546 in 2013 – our San Marcos campus also has expanded. Today it consists of a 486-acre main campus and 5,038 additional acres in recreational, instructional, farm and ranch land.

The Texas State campus is as diverse as the students who live and learn here. Our hilly grounds are home to 268 buildings. Some, like Old Main, are as old as the university itself. Others, such as the Performing Arts Center, opened in 2014 and more new buildings are scheduled for completion soon.

At The Meadows Center for Water and the Environment on the Texas State campus, you can see the second largest springs in Texas through the floor of a glass bottom boat or glass-bottom kayak. These springs feed the San Marcos River and are home to eight endangered species, including the Texas blind salamander. Our campus is one of the best places in the world to study aquatic ecosystems and species.
