*If you are a new believer, you can skip "(advanced)" parts in each session. If you are in 35 weeks study, do not skip advanced part.

You can download it on your smartphone or tablet as well but typing on it can be limited depending on which device you are using.)



*Note this is a visual way of summarizing the Bible focusing on the gospel of Christ Jesus who is the Savior and the only way to be saved. Watch these videos 2-3 more at another time and be familiar with them. We will come back to these videos at a later session.
