Principals to safeguard children from harm

Brown Shoes Triathlon Club is committed to safeguarding children and by working under the guidance of Triathlon Ireland's Safeguarding Policies our staff, both volunteers and employed, working with our young people, throughout the organisation, seek to create a safe environment for young people to grow and develop within triathlon. The following set of principles should be adhered to; importance of childhood, the needs of the child, integrity in relationships, fair play, quality atmosphere & ethos, competition and equality.

Procedures
