Child Safeguarding Statement

Ballincollig AFC in accordance with the FAI Rulebook, Child Welfare and Safeguarding policy, other policies, procedures and our legislative requirements have agreed this Child Safeguarding Statement which is binding on all members.

Ballincollig AFC is a Football Club operating on a local scale in the Cork City Suburb of Ballincollig, it's aim is to provide sporting activities and opportunities for children and young people through participation in the club. The Club offers footballing skills to children, young people and adults, aging from 6 to over 35.

Ballincollig AFC recruits over 40 volunteers with over 350 players (including those in the Academy). Ballincollig AFC is committed to the safeguarding of children and by working under the guidance of our Safeguarding Policies and Procedures, employed by our members and volunteers working with our children and young people, throughout the Club. The ethos is to enable a safe and fun environment for children, young people and adults to participate and enjoy sport fully.

Principles to Safeguard Children from Harm

This statement recognises that in accordance with legislation and the requirements of FAI Rulebook, FAI Child Welfare and Safeguarding policy, other FAI policies and procedures that the welfare and interests of children are paramount in all circumstances.

Ballincollig AFC is established on a number of core principles:

the needs of the Child, integrity and respect, environment, equality, fair play, welfare and safety in football.

These underlying principles underpin our rules, policies and procedures to ensure that when Children participate in our activities, they do so, as far as is practicable, in a safe and enjoyable environment.

Risk Assessment

In preparing this statement Ballincollig AFC have completed a Risk Assessment of the potential risk of harm to children when they are participating in any of our games and attending our activities. The risks were reviewed under the following headings; Club and Coaching Practices; Complaints & Discipline; Reporting Procedures; Use of Facilities; Recruitment; Communications; and General Risk of Harm. - Procedure for appointing a relevant person.
