Life-Changing Prayer: A Prayer of Availability

Opening Discussion:

- 1. How would you describe your current level of availability to God? What factors influence this?
- 2. Share a time when you felt God calling you to do something. How did you respond?

Key Takeaways:

- 1. Our perception of God greatly influences how we respond to His call.
- 2. Three biblical responses to God's call:
 - a. Jonah: "Here I am, I'm not going!"
 - b. Moses: "Here I am, send someone else."
 - c. Isaiah: "Here I am, send me!"
- 3. To fully surrender to God, we need:
 - a. A genuine experience with God's presence
 - b. Recognition of our unrighteousness and God's grace
 - c. Understanding of God's forgiveness and grace

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Which of the three biblical responses (Jonah, Moses, or Isaiah) do you relate to most? Why?
- 2. What fears or reservations do you have about making yourself fully available to God?
- 3. How has your experience of God's presence impacted your willingness to serve Him?
- 4. In what ways does recognizing our own sinfulness help us become more available to God?

5. How does understanding God's grace and forgiveness motivate us to surrender to Him?

Practical Applications:

1. Daily Prayer Challenge: Start each day this week with a prayer of availability, saying "Here

I am, God. Send me."

2. Presence Seeking: Set aside time to intentionally seek God's presence through worship,

prayer, or meditation on Scripture.

3. Grace Reflection: Write down specific ways you've experienced God's grace and

forgiveness. Reflect on how this impacts your willingness to serve Him.

4. Availability Audit: Identify areas in your life where you might be resisting God's call. What

steps can you take to become more available in these areas?

Closing Prayer:

Lead the group in a prayer of surrender and availability to God, asking Him to use each

person for His purposes.

Scripture for Further Study:

- Ephesians 2:1-9

- Isaiah 6:1-8

- Jonah 1:1-3, 4:1-2

- Exodus 3:10-11

- James 4:8

Encourage group members to memorize and meditate on Isaiah 6:8 throughout the week:

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?' And

I said, 'Here am I. Send me!'"
