The limited summer rainfall has not translated to scarcity of land conservation victories, support and activity though.

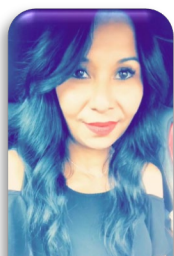
- Nationally, the Land and Water Conservation Fund was permanently fully funded at \$900 million every year. Since 1964, this fund has protected national parks, rivers and lakes, national forests, wildlife refuges, and provides State and local land conservation and recreation projects. Until 2020, much of that funding was diverted for other uses.
- Locally, Hays County voted to move forward with a parks and open space bond set for November. If successful, the bond will support new parks, trails, open spaces and natural areas in Hays County.
- And within GBRT, thanks to generous support from the Land Trust Alliance, the Burdine Johnson Foundation, and the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority, we are able to move the ball forward at our Plum Creek Wetlands Preserve. We are in the beginning stages of creating a master plan and will be hosting our first annual volunteer reforestation event on site November 14<sup>th</sup>. Additionally, we have gained interest from many like-minded entities to support both of these activities.

Looking ahead to the fall and winter months, GBRT is excited to continue working on several new conservation easement projects. We are also proud to be working on new and innovative ways to support our mission of land conservation. I want to thank those who support the work we do and make it possible to have such a rewarding career.

The Guadalupe-Blanco River Trust is grateful to receive a grant from The Burdine Johnson Foundation in the amount of \$15,000 to help support the Plum Creek Wetlands Preserve Reforestation Project. These funds will help to offset the cost of the project to help restore the 265-acres back to its native vegetation. Volunteers will help with planting 1000+ bare-root seedlings in certain areas on the property. The tree species chosen are native to the Blackland Prairie ecoregion for both wetlands and non-wetlands. The property includes diverse habitat types including a mile of riparian woodlands along plum creek, and emergent, forested wetlands. The 29 constructed wetlands on site are very inviting to wildlife including the White-Tailed Deer, many species of raptors, waterfowl, amphibians, reptiles and pollinators. This is a great volunteering opportunity for Master Naturalists, Master Gardeners, members of clubs and organizations, students, local community members, families, or anyone seeking educational hours towards a project.

The Guadalupe-Blanco River Trust has been awarded the Land Trust Alliance 2020 Advancement Initiative Grant in the amount of \$7500. This grant program has been designed to deliver tailored organizational and leadership development assistance to select land trusts and land trust state associations that are committed to growing their capacity and advancing their conservation impact. GBRT plans to use these funds for a Master Development Plan for the Plum Creek Wetlands Preserve.
