This training reviews some basic assumptions and problems that are encountered in all initial assessments of clients. An approach to assessment based on attachment principles is offered. This approach involves describing the child's working model of relationships and utilizes data from the child's experience with caretakers and data from his or her current interpersonal functioning. How this data can be used in relational work and planning is discussed.
