### Building Resiliency

10:00 AM- 1:00 PM

The focus of this training is to provide caregivers information to build understanding and strategies for providing trauma-informed and culturally responsive care to address grief and loss experienced by youth in the foster care system. Participants will gain an understanding about how trauma that foster youth experience link to how they might act out their trauma and grief in addition to some of the long-term consequences of excessive emotional stress for youth in foster care placement.

- Become more trauma informed
- Learn how children in care experience grief and loss
- Learn how to support and foster resilience

### Progressive Crisis

1:30 PM- 4:00 PM

This training introduces participants to a crisis communication model that utilizes verbal crisis communication. Multiple crisis models and effective response and de-escalation strategies and interventions will be provided to assist caregivers when foster youth are in crisis.

- Understand the importance of self-care, self-control, and own triggers
- Gain knowledge of the escalation curve and crisis communication
- Explore various interventions
