Substance Abuse: Relapse Prevention

Addiction to substances is a problem that often leads to relapse (recurrence of severe Substance Use Disorder symptoms) thereby making the prevention of relapse one of the critical elements of effective treatment. Studies have shown that 54 percent of all alcohol and other drug abuse patients can be expected to relapse, and that 61 percent of that number will have multiple periods of relapse. Although relapse is a symptom of addiction, it is preventable. This class will examine the process of relapse, along with information about recognizing its "warning signs," or triggers, and the elements of relapse prevention treatment methodologies.

This course qualifies for 6 hours of continuing education.
