

H.Y.P.E. BY THE NUMBERS

Helping Young People Elevate | 90-Day Community Impact Snapshot

H.Y.P.E. is an Akron-based 501(c)(3) youth nonprofit built around direct, consistent support. The work reaches young people where they are - in community spaces, at home, in court, in juvenile detention, and through direct calls and conversations. H.Y.P.E. combines prevention and intervention with mentorship, accountability, advocacy, leadership development, and real-world guidance.

Impact at a Glance

40-55 Youth engaged weekly through H.Y.P.E. class events	15-25 Different youth reached weekly through direct conversations	5 Home visits completed in an average week
10-15 Youth supported weekly through crisis intervention	7 People helped with employment opportunities	8 Incidents stopped, de-escalated, or diverted from deeper system involvement

Direct Community Support

Juvenile detention: H.Y.P.E. maintains regular visits to the Dan Street Juvenile Detention Center, including Tuesday and Thursday engagement with young people.

Court advocacy: H.Y.P.E. is present in court approximately three days each week, supporting an average of 3-4 different young people per week through accountability, advocacy, and guidance.

Family resources: Countless families have been connected with resource information and support related to housing, transportation, food, rehabilitation services, and other needs, with continued availability for follow-up.

Prevention + Intervention

H.Y.P.E.'s community work is approximately **50% prevention and 50% intervention**. Support includes conflict mediation, crisis response, job assistance, home visits, court presence, juvenile detention visits, and ongoing communication with young people and their families.

Life-Changing Opportunities

84 people attended the H.Y.P.E. + Village Keepers of Ohio Cedar Point experience in August 2026.

Experiences like this give young people positive memories, exposure beyond their everyday environment, and opportunities to build stronger relationships with trusted adults and one another.

What These Numbers Represent

Every number represents a real person, family, conversation, visit, or situation. H.Y.P.E. measures impact not only by attendance, but by consistency - showing up when a young person calls, being present in difficult moments, helping families find resources, creating positive experiences, and giving young people another path forward.
