Picker Munson

Picker Munson grew up in Black Forest. He follows the tradition of his family of heavy equipment operators in assisting when heavy equipment is needed. Picker owns Munson Landscaping and Excavating which has about 18 employees. He has a long history of assisting the Black Forest Community Club and the Black Forest Community Foundation with



maintenance and construction projects including preparing the old Fire Department building site after its 2012 demolition and the 2013 Black Forest Fire for the current uses as the Log School Park and construction of the Black Forest Pavilion. That project included installation of the commemorative pavers at the east end of the Pavilion. Prior to the 2013 Black Forest Fire Picker built the retaining wall at the east entrance of the Community Hall. This tiered wall provides a seating area near the front door, and increased parking in front of the Community Hall with access to Black Forest Road. After the 2013 fire Picker Munson hauled mulch to cover the Log School Park area after rains had created mud and also re-graveled the Community Hall Parking lot. It was Picker, with his water tanker, who saved the historic buildings, including the Black Forest Community Hall, in the center of Black Forest during the height of the devastating 2013 fire. Picker has also mitigated several areas of the north Community Club Property. Picker was able to help a severely burned horse after the fire. The horse was successfully transported to veterinary care and survived.

Jeff and Kristen Schickler

Jeff came to Colorado from New York in 1984 and settled in Forest Collins. He has been in the food industry all of his adult life. Kristen is from Maui, Hawaii but lived in Fort Collins at the time they met. Jeff has a small business management degree and Kristen has a BS in landscaping design for CSU.

They have two grown sons, Christopher and Sean.



They have lived in the Black Forest Community since 2002 and own and operate the Firehouse on the Run BBQ and the gas station. They moved to the BF Community for the charm and love where they live...close to the park and the Community Center.

Their home burned in the 2013 BF fire and they have rebuilt . During COVID, the Firehouse on the Run stayed open for pick up and delivery options.

In addition to providing services to Black Forest with their business, Kristen has served on the longstanding Black Forest Educational Opportunity foundation board for five years. They also donate to the Black Forest Boy Scout Troops, and hold fundraisers for Wolford School and the Black Forest Festival.

Last year when the catastrophic fires occurred in Lahina, Hawaii, Kristen raised \$3200 in Black Forest (also a fire-impacted community) for Trilogy, a fire assistance organization in Hawaii to support the Lahina Catamoran business which suffered damage to their boats while pulling people out of the water during the Lahina fire.

Jeff is an avid fly fisherman and Kris loves gardening and hiking.

Oliver and Patricia Hunnybun

Oliver and Patricia Hunnybun came to Black Forest in fall of 2011. Oliver works for Western Digital in Tech support and Training and both operate Doggie Daycare and Boarding in Black Forest.



They participated in the Black Forest Business Group from 2012-14 after the 2013 fire. This group raised over \$3,000 for the Black Forest Fire Department.

During the 2013 Fire they assisted horse owners and hosted nine dogs and seven cats. During the 2019 Bomb Cyclone, they assisted neighbors with water, care packages and gift certificates.

In 2019 Patricia founded Black Forest Prepare to provide residents and businesses with information on

survival, preparedness, self-defense and awareness. This included crime prevention, self-defense classes and introduction to weapons. Additional topics were hydroponics, planting, and raising livestock. COVID 19 shut down this effort.

During the 2019 Bomb Cyclone power outage they provided water, care packages, groceries and gift certificates to neighbors.

Coordination of the Grab-Bag program for local firefighters was done in 2020.

Assisting in the removal of extra mulch from the Black Forest Slash and Mulch Site by hauling mulch to others in the forest occurred in 2023, along with repairing the wooden bench at the Old Log School Park and providing photographic services at the 2013 Fire Remembrance event. Oliver helped to measure the space to the Artisan and Business Booth Fair and created the map used to reserve the booths. He also created the 2024 Black Forest Biergarten fundraiser Logo.

They enjoy singing with the Black Forest Choir, scuba diving and photography.

Noxious Weed Update for El Paso County by Nick Daniel, Noxious Weed Specialist

2024 has been a very busy year across El Paso County, but especially in the noxious weed world. Thus far I have had a little over 60 acres of right of ways and open space treated with more in the works. A combination of a warm start to the season and mid-season moisture has led to an explosion of a handful of weeds. I've been seeing quite a bit of leafy spurge, hoary cress, and diffuse knapweed throughout the county but mainly along arterials. In Black Forest, everyone should be on the lookout for Scotch thistle. It's having a banner year, and I'm seeing it creep further north along Vollmer Rd and is moving south along Highway 83. It's the very large thistle that has a very silvery appearance. Eradication is required county-wide, and trust me, you don't want it proliferating on your beautiful lots in Black Forest.

Another weed to lookout for is the List C, chicory. It has cornflower blue flowers and is another one to pull or mow if you see it on your land. As always, if anyone needs advice or weed identification, please get in touch: EVSnoxiousweeds@elpasoco.com

One of the longest-running tenants at our community hall is The Black Rose Acoustic Society. April of this year was the 30th anniversary of their roots-music concerts in our hall!

If you ask about acoustic music in the Colorado Springs area, folks will undoubtedly mention The Black Rose and the BFCC. In 1994, several local musicians formed this nonprofit organization to promote folk, bluegrass, Americana, swing, fiddle tunes, Celtic, and other musical styles played on traditional instruments. Today, The Black Rose and our beloved log hall have become *the* home of acoustic music in the whole Pikes Peak Region.
