With only 124 people voting, the new Black Forest Fire Department board will be Kiersten Tarvainen and Nathan Dowden (both on the board already) and Kiersten's brother John.

**Back Yard Plan**

This is the work that has been discussed and approved by the Black Forest Community Club Backyard Committee and the members present for the vote. In order to get this much needed work done before the 2025 Black Forest Festival, we will need to start soon.

- 1) Perform boundary survey of property.
- 2) Remove three beetle infested trees at south side of driveway entrance. This will accommodate new driveway direction.
- 3) Cut new driveway south through trees, curve around to the west, then north to connect to existing driveway. (There are green marker flags marking new driveway path.)
- 4) Re-work drainage channel north of the club off Black Forest Road.
- 5) Remove old water feature.
- 6) Remove cistern and fill.
- 7) Remove all tree stumps.
- 8) Lower old well head and install new cover to allow to be driven over.
- 9) Lower grade of north/west corner of lot 1 1/2' - 2.'
- 10) Spread dirt to level south/west area.
- 11) Back fill and grade washed out area on west side of property.
- 12) Create flat area for demo garden.

**There's a new dump in town.** For those who have stumps and bulk pine needles to get rid of, check out The Dump. It just opened in May.

The Dump is located off Volmer Road on a road going east just north of Bill's Tool Rental. It is a transfer station run by the same company as the Monument dump on Hwy 105. Contact info: 719 792-3867 woodmendump.com They take stumps and pine needles and charge per weight. The charge for mattresses is wrong on the sign posted along the road before reaching the scales. \$59 is the correct cost.

## **Second summer article from Nick Daniel, El Paso County Noxious Weed Specialist**

Greetings Black Forest residents! With the good moisture we've been getting and temperatures trending up, it's now time to start thinking about controlling warm season weeds. For June, I'd like to focus on our two largest thistles: musk thistle and Scotch thistle.

While both species are large biennials, there are a couple key identification differences. In the rosette stage, Scotch thistle has very hairy leaves that appear silver to blue-green in comparison to musk thistle leaves which have a shinier appearance and a prominent white mid-rib going down the center of each leaf. Both species have sharp spines on their leaves. Musk thistle flowers are pink to purple and have prominent, sharp bracts behind each flower, resembling a crown. Scotch thistles have reddish to violet-colored flowers that bloom at the tips of branches. Both species can grow to over six feet tall and can produce over 10,000 seeds per plant. Musk and Scotch thistles both like to invade rangelands, over-grazed pastures, roadsides, and disturbed areas. These two noxious thistle species are best controlled in the rosette stage when they can be easily dug out. Just be sure to break to the taproot at least 3 inches below the soil surface. If you catch thistles flowering on your land, be sure to remove the flowers and securely bag them before removing or spraying the rest of the plant. There is also a biocontrol available for musk thistle if you have a severe infestation.

**A Note from Leif Garrison concerning the Log School Park.**

Dear fellow BFCC member,

On behalf of the Friends of the Black Forest Log School (and Park), I have a simple message: We need your help.

Many of you have toured the Log School or attended one of free the summer jazz concerts in the Log School Park or perhaps walked through the park on your way to or from a meeting or event at the Club, but you may not have thought much about who takes care of the log school, the park, and its landscaping. The answer is the Friends of the Log School, assisted by several Black Forest friends and neighbors. But the ranks of this dedicated group of volunteers have become noticeably thinner recently.

Some of our long-time park volunteers have moved or passed away or are otherwise no longer able to help out, and the able-bodied volunteers who are available to help with watering the park this summer are pretty few in number so far. The park is not very large and doesn't have too many requirements, but all the trees and bushes etc. do require watering once a week during the summer months (May thru September).

So, we need help with keeping everything watered, and would be very grateful if some of our friends from the BFCC could team up with the Friends of the Log School for this purpose.

Once you open up the calendar, you'll see that a number of weeks are already spoken for, so if just a few BFCC members (including family members or friends) could sign up for just one or two of the open weeks, that would fill out the schedule for this year.

BTW we can arrange for a "training" session (to show where the hoses are kept and how to turn on the water etc.) as may be requested, and please note that most people can get the watering done in about 1.5 to 2 hours or so (it goes faster with two people).

After volunteering with the BFCC and the Log School for multiple decades (and counting), I know that there are many Forest residents who are ready, willing and able to pitch in to help take care of our community—all we need to do is get the word out about when and where help is needed!
