
Geometric Shapes

To begin the unit, we first experimented with card to make geometrical form in maquettes (as seen on the right). Once we were comfortable using the medium of card, we used our source photography to design 3D sculptures based on geometric shapes in the college's architecture.

To finish the unit, we created line drawings from our photographs. However, instead of practicing controlled representation: we used our non-dominant hand, in continuous line; gripping only the end of the pen to illustrate our photos (as seen on the right). The best line drawing was then projected up, to be painted in a contemporary style.

While experimenting with a palette knife, I produced a very successful portrait of a fish, showing the the beautiful corruscating textures of it's skin. After being advised by my teacher to explore more using this theme, I proceeded to base this project on the expressive qualities in frozen supermarket sealife.

Painting & Print making

Instead of scraping the paint, I experimented with making more gentle marks, while still using a palette knife. On the right is a collagraph print which I have gone over with coloured inks.



Brush Painting

For my final painting, I transferred what I had learnt with a palette knife, to a brush technique. Using colder, more natural colours, I continued the lose mark making, while still showing control in my representation.


I have used both traditional and mono-printing on card to illustrate the landscapes I photographed.



















