GENERAL JOHN BELL HOOD

West Point Graduate and Commander of the famous Hoods "Texas Brigade".

Hood was severely wounded at the Battle of Chickamauga, requiring his right leg to be amputated. He survived against extreme odds and was promoted for his bravery. He returned to the field despite his injuries and fought strapped to his horse. He spent his final years in New Orleans.



BRIGADIER GENERAL JOHN HUNT MORGAN

#### THUNDERBOLT OF THE CONFEDERACY

Born at Huntsville, Alabama on June 1, 1825. Killed at Greenville, Kentucky on September 4, 1864 and is buried in the Lexington Cemetery. On July 4, 1862, Morgan set out on a thousand-mile ride through Kentucky – destroying railroad and telegraph lines, seizing supplies, taking prisoners, and unleashing hell on the federals.




