September Birthday



John Andrew Norrid August 1836-October 1905

Below is a copy of an email received by Dave Guise concerning the above Confederate Veteran. It is a testament to the work Camp 1904 does. The newsletter is the best place for all to see and know first hand that the work does not go unnoticed.

This evening as I journeyed from Abilene to Hico via Cross Plains (I usually travel the interstate), the Confederate flag and monument at Sipe Springs caught my attention. My Great-great grandfather John Andrew Norrid, a Confederate veteran who migrated from northern Louisiana to Comanche County during the 1870's. He had a farm in Sipe Springs. So, after reading the inscription on the monument, I felt a close affinity with those who erected it. I really appreciate those who initiated such a special effort to recognize the settlers of Sipe Springs. The plaque on the back of the monument led me to you.

Norrid served in the 9th Louisiana Infantry (part of Lee's Tigers and Jackson's Foot Cavalry) and was paroled at Appomattox Courthouse. Having grown up reading Joseph Altsheler's works of historical fiction about the War Between the States, it was quite moving to discover my ancestor had been part of the valiant efforts of the Army of Northern Virginia. About three years ago I had an opportunity to visit Appomattox Courthouse and walked the trail Norrid would have walked from his camp to the place where he and his comrades stacked their arms in surrender. I've read it was an extremely poignant time for those who made it that far. One of Norrid's cousins had been captured just a few days before at Farmville. One of his brothers and two of his cousins died during the War. Norrid is buried in the Oakwood Cemetery in Comanche. One time when I visited his grave, I noticed Confederate flags on a number of graves, but I was disappointed to see there wasn't one on his grave. Since 2010, I have lived in Hico. There were quite a few Confederate veterans who settled in Hico as well. They had annual Confederate reunions here for years. One of those veterans, Major Ben Randals, of Tennessee, lived in Sipe Springs before moving to Hico, where he operated an academy. Another one of my great-great grandfathers, Martin William Bundick, was a Confederate veteran, having served in Waul's Legion. He lived in Gonzales County. One of his cousins died during the War at Holly Springs, Mississippi.

I am hoping to attend your next meeting. If that doesn't work out, I hope to attend another one sometime soon.Again, thanks for the Second Texas Frontier District Camp 1904's efforts at preserving our history.
