




NOVEMBER IN CONFEDERATE HISTORY

BIRTHDAYS


LIEUTENANT GENERAL JUBAL A. EARLY

Born November 3, 1816, Franklin County, VA - Died March 2, 1894
an American lawyer, West Point Graduate, A key Confederate defender
of the Shenandoah Valley, during the Valley campaign of 1864.




LIEUTENANT GENERAL AMBROSE POWELL HILL

Born November 9, 1825 - Killed April 2, 1865, at the Third Battle of
Petersburg. West Point graduate. Served in the Mexican American War.



BRIGADIER GENERAL BEN McCULLOCH

A soldier in the Texas Revolution, Texas Ranger, major-general
in the Texas militia, and a brigadier-general in the Confederate
Army. Born November 11, 1811, died at the Battle of
Pea Ridge, March 7, 1862.



MAJOR GENERAL FITZHUGH LEE

Born November 19, 1835, died April 28, 1905. 40th
Governor of Virginia, diplomat, army general in the
Spanish American War. He was the nephew of Robert E. Lee.

1851 Brass Frame Confederate Griswold & Gunnison

Pietta 1851 Confederate Navy Black Powder Revolver
This six-shot .44 caliber revolver was made under contract to the Confederate government. **It is a brass framed copy of the Colt 1851 Navy revolver.** Connecticut Yankee Samuel Griswold set up a cotton gin factory in Georgia in 1830. The village of Griswoldville grew around the factory. In 1862, Griswold produced pikes for volunteers from the state of Georgia. The factory soon began producing revolvers for the Confederacy. No other Confederate factory produced more revolvers than Griswold & Gunnison. Griswoldville was the first town burned by Sherman's troops on his march to the sea. This 1851 navy model features a brass frame, blued parts, brass backstrap and triggerguard, hexagon barrel, and a walnut navy size grip. ***A beautiful replica to add to your collection!***


