ECYD & Blaze


"Led by Fr Aaron, ECYD (encounters, convictions, your decisions) is an opportunity for adolescence to become friends with Christ. My brother Nathan began living the ECYD lifestyle as he engaged in a weekly activity and Gospel reflection with some boys in his class. Joe Coffey is now helping out with this group and other ECYD groups in the area.

After seeing my brother Nathan's joy and watching his faith blossom I thought back to my 7th grade self. In middle school, when I was Nathan's age, I found myself trying to fit in with the "cool crowd." The innocence and carefree joy I had as a child started to fade as I began to care more about what other people thought of me. Reflecting back on this, I was convinced I wasn't the only one that struggled in middle school. In today's culture, instagram, snapchat and tictok only add to this problem.

After speaking to Fr Aaron, he encouraged me to pray about the desire I had on my heart to serve in this way. The need became even more apparent as I talked to a friend of mine who currently teaches Religion to the 7th grade class at Saint Peter and Paul. We connected and with prayer, some help from Ft Aaron and enthusiasm from the parents and staff at Saints Peter and Paul school we launched a program called BLAZE (a Walking with Purpose Bible Study for middle school girls) for the 7th grade girls at Saints Peter and Paul School.

13 girls participate in BLAZE this fall! For the past seven weeks, on Wednesday afternoons, Pia and I were welcomed by Mrs. Krieman into her classroom where we had a snack, fun activity and dove into the Bible Study together with the girls. It was a privilege to sit down with them and discuss their identity as daughters of Christ. We plan to continue with Blaze in January."




The Magdala House Young Women's Retreat


