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Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina and having lived for some time in Europe, self-taught artist Fernando Silva draws his inspiration from the impressionist styles of Van Gogh and Gaugin, as well as the contemporary New York artists His Art embraces the vibrancy and diversity of the big cities. His colors and constructs reveal a relevance and passion for each subject, portraying with an elegant simplicity, especially New York's everyday life, captured through the eyes of a modern-day impressionist.

In his search for fulfillment, Silva captures the fragile, elusive motion of a city that is both alive and historic. Each work metaphorically proclaims the beauty and charm of places that those both familiar and unfamiliar with the city interpret as the essence of New York. Through movement and exaggeration, Silva's dramatic paintings connect profoundly to each viewer. In this, Silva's works are fundamentally surreal and fluid, depicting landmarks and scenes imbued with an unstoppable optimism bestowed only by a truly imaginative observer. Silva's modern-day impressionist oils, Acrylics and Gold defy convention, extolling the virtues of the early masters, while adding the soul of a contemporary artist to each interpretive brush stroke.

Silva Finds inspiration in the beauty of everyday life. Silva's colorful oil painted canvases are both a depiction of moments experienced in the present, and a reflection on the past - particularly the history of Impressionist painting. Painting primarily cityscapes, Silva's paint dances across the canvas, vibrating with energy. Silva himself cites his upbringing in Buenos Aires as a strong influence on his art because of the colorful artwork on the streets and the admiration for tango dancers that he was surrounded by.

Of recent, Mr. John Wright has expanded beyond retail into the gallery world where he now curates his own work and that of his continually expanding tribe at the Blue Building Gallery in Midtown Manhattan.



# Ling Ling Chen, Pianist

Artist Statement

Born from Chinese immigrants in Australia, I was given a violin at the age of 3. 'Half hour practices every day', my parents would utter. Strings and I did not get along but the moment my fingers tinkled those ivory keys, magic. Soon thereafter, a 20 odd year love affair with the piano was born with most of my life spent alone in a practice room perfecting musical sentences from Beethoven to Tchaikovsky 7 hours a day. I became obsessed with the allure of channeling the sturm und drang, pastorals, and different shades of colors I could achieve on the piano. Eventually my career flew me across the world where I could connect people through musical experiences at the Sydney Opera House, Lincoln Center, Melbourne Recital Center, and World Trade Center to name a few.

I prepared for competitions and became an international laureate as the prize winner of the John Allison National Piano Competition and New York International Piano Competition, gold medalist of the International Youth Arts Piano Festival, recipient of the National Premier Awards, an AMF finalist and competitor at the esteemed Ettlingen, Keri Keri and Lev Vlassenko International Piano Competitions. Accolades aside, I fell in love with storytelling through chamber music, performing with some of the most incredible musicians from Eric Silberger to Zoe Black. The year 2017 marked a huge shift where I became the only pianist accepted to Olga Kern's studio at the Manhattan School of Music to complete my Master of Music. Suddenly, I was in the hustle and bustle of NYC. I soon became a Steinway Educator teaching over 200+ students and found joy sharing how to breathe life into compositions.

With the sudden onset of COVID, my journey took a different turn. I'm currently completing my MBA and lined up to work at TikTok after I graduate. Although I am pursuing an alternate passion, I still find myself foraying back into the creative space where my heart truly belongs. Afterall, I believe that music and art is the poetic language of the human spirit. It is simply the wine that fills the cup of silence. Today, I'm focused on educating artists on their brand and business, as well as collaborating with like-minded talents on meaningful programmatic projects.



## Quenu Sampson, Cross Modal Violinist

#### Artist Statement

Bronx NY native, and violinist Qenu Sampson, creates a transformative musical experience for his audience by fusing his life experiences with the cords of his violin. As a multi-instrumentalist and composer Qenu's artistic repertoire includes but not limited to jazz, film scoring, classical, fusion, electric and house music. He was accepted into the Juilliard Music Advancement Program at age 11 and the ASCAP's award-winning New York Symphony program at age 12, where he was noted to be the youngest musician by several years.

He intensively studied the violin at the Putney School, Sphinx Performance Academy Interlochen Arts Camp, and the Idyllwild Arts Academy before attending Berklee College of Music. His dynamism for sharing his life's narrative through his music, often brings him back to the heart of NYC. With a broad interest in music and the impact of sound on life experiences, Qenu's current interest includes cross sensory modalities. His current project supports that initiative, as he seeks to create a cross modal perception experience for an audience through wine and music.



### Al Diaz

Artist Statement

Al Díaz's career spans five decades. Born and raised Puerto Rican in New York City, by age 15 he was an influential first-generation subway graffiti artist known as "BOMB- ONE." His friendship and artistic collaboration with high school schoolmate Jean- Michel Basquiat on SAMO©, (a late 70s Avant-garde graffiti tag project) has been noted often in contemporary art history. Díaz later contributed percussion to numerous musical recordings and performances, including Basquiat's historic 1983 record, "Beat Bop," (considered to be one of the earliest hip-hop albums).

Díaz is sought-after as an expert of New York City counterculture art. He appears often in publications, as a highlighted speaker for a variety of panel discussions at universities and museums (including Smithsonian Institution, the Brooklyn Museum, The New School and Christie's Education), and has been featured in several films, including Boom for Real: The Late Teenage Years of Jean-Michel Basquiat, BBC's American Masters — Basquiat: Rage to Riches and Jean-Michel Basquiat: The Radiant Child. Díaz' current creative practice in Brooklyn includes gathering the standard "WET PAINT" signage used throughout the NYC MTA, and reconstructing them to create clever, poignant anagrams in various mixed media and public art formats. His work is shown and privately collected internationally.

In 2018, Diaz authored SAMOO...SINCE 1978, an in-depth, color illustrated history of the street art legacy that he began with Basquiat in the late 70s. A notebook that Díaz made with Basquiat in his teens is currently held in the collection of the Yale University Beinecke Library.

## Mekia Machine

Artist Statement

Mekia Machine is a Jamaican-born artist who was raised in the USA for much of her life; she has a multidisciplinary practice that ranges across painting, sound, music and performance. Her work investigates aesthetic and societal norms through conceptions of time, identity, memory, and place, specifically in cultures where loss and trauma is a substantial part of daily life.

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In addition to exhibiting, Machine was one of the winners of This Art is Your Art, 2016 with Artsy, The Robert Rauschenberg Foundation and the White House Historical Association, for her short film on painting artist Alma Thomas!s portrait which was part of a 4-month installation and she was invited to join First Lady Michelle Obama at the Celebration of 20th Century Art in the White House. Additionally, Machine was awarded the fully funded Liquitex | Just Imagine Residency in 2021. Mekia graduated from Columbia University with a BA in Visual Arts (2019) and is currently living and working in Harlem, New York City, with her two daughters Taylor and Nola.
