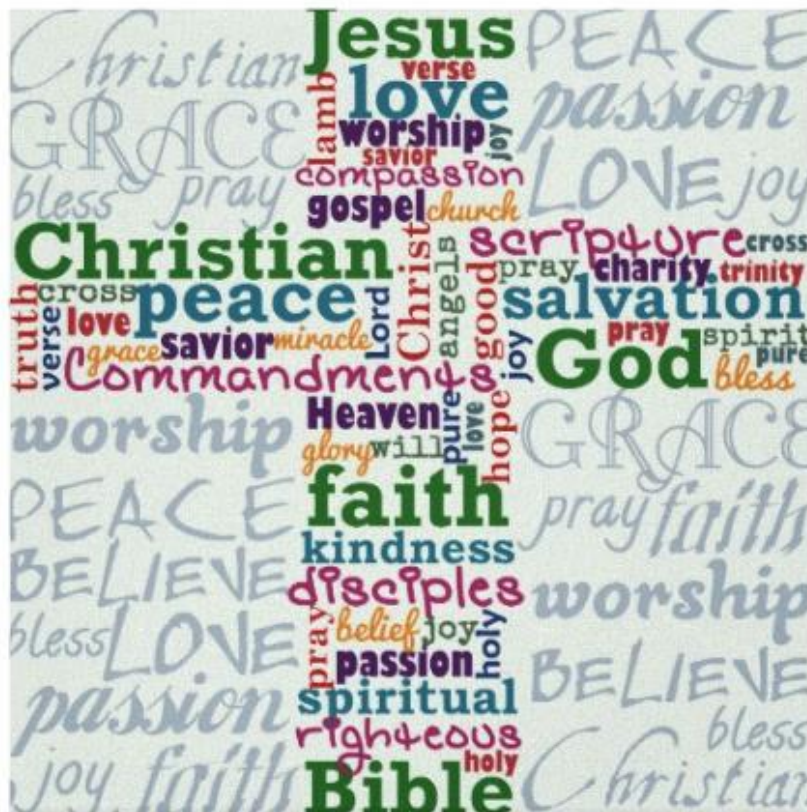

During these years of confirmation, you have learned about your own faith, the Lutheran faith, the Bible, and the Catechism. Learning about faith is a life-long goal for us as Christians, so this isn't a "final" project! This Fall Faith Packet serves as background for your last few classes of confirmation this Fall.

- As you are working on this packet, be sure to use all resources available to you! Ask parents, grandparents, look on-line, reference your Bible, ask Dan Hackbarth, your small group leader, and/or Pastor Bahe.






5/ What are some of your earliest thoughts and/or images of God? Have those changed? If so, what are they today? If they have not, what are some other images people might have of God?


Watch it through once before reading below. Then.....

- What is Linus saying when he drops his blanket?


Read Luke 2:10~ "And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people."

Do you think Charles Schultz [from Minnesota, by the way] chose to have Linus drop his security blanket deliberately at this point? If so, why? If not, why not?




11/ One thing you know for certain about God is...




12/ Ask your parents: why do they want you to be confirmed? Write the answer here.




13/ How would you finish this statement? *One thing I really don't understand about faith is...*

17/ **Read** First Peter, chapter two, verse 9 [**1 Peter 2:**], what words does God use to describe you?


18/ Something I have to offer the world is...

25/ My Faith Statement

In the Lutheran church, we use 3 creeds [Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian] to publicly state our faith. However, being able to profess [say] our faith in our own words is important too.

In your own way, tell what you believe about God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. You may use the above creeds to help you get started {just google them}.

Some questions to help you get started [these are just thought starters, you do not need to answer each one]

Who is God?

What does God do?

What is God like?

How would you answer someone who asks you: "who is Jesus"?

What does it mean to you that Jesus died on the cross? That He rose again?

What does it mean to follow Jesus?

How would you explain who the Holy Spirit is?

Describe a time when you think the Holy Spirit was active in your life.

What does it mean to you when you say "I am a Christian"?

It is important to remember that we believe in the Triune God, so your Faith Statement should include something about God the Father, Son {Jesus}, and the Holy Spirit.

Some ideas: Use any format you wish for this! Be creative!

- Write a poem
- Draw something {be sure to write an explanation about your drawing and how/why it expresses your faith}
- Photographs {be sure to write an explanation about your pictures and how/why they express your faith}
- Make a video

- Write a story with 1 of the characters being a person of deep faith, and the other a person who doubts God even exists
- Describe a favorite movie and how it relates to your faith
- Describe a favorite book and how it relates to your faith
- Write a skit about your faith
- Write a faith statement {a personal creed: I believe...}
- Write a song about God
- Any other ideas you may have!

You may have to add pages to this document to write out your draft of your faith statement.

These faith statements will be displayed on Confirmation Sunday.
