We are people of prayer. The disciples eagerly wanted to learn how to pray so Jesus taught them the Lord's Prayer. There is always more to learn about this precious prayer. Every Wednesday night during Lent, we are focusing on one of the petitions of the Lord's Prayer. We are participating in a Round-Robin sermon series—Pastor preaches elsewhere and we have guest preachers.

That means you get to experience a variety of preaching styles. Three Wednesday night services left for this Lenten season. The rest of the Lent schedule is:

Mar. 24—Pastor Bahe *"Hallowed be Thy name."*

Wednesday Eve Opening Liturgy for Lent

L: Gracious Lord, we gather in your holy name,

C: ready to hear your promises and your commands.

L: We gather in this sacred place,

C: the day has been full, and we need to be fed.

L: O God, through Jesus' sacrifice you have restored us as your forgiven children, and so we confidently pray:

C: Our Father, who art in heaven,

L: Help us to honor your holy name by the things we do and say:

C: Hallowed be thy name.

L: Give us your Holy Spirit to rule in our hearts, and use us to extend your kingdom of love and grace to others:

C: Thy kingdom come.

L: Make us zealous to carry out your will as gladly as the angels do, and help us to conform our will to yours.

C: Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

L: Provider God, since you are gracious and abundant teach us to live thankfully and gratefully, one day at a time—sharing generously and trusting in your goodness always:

C: Give us this day our daily bread.

L: Continue to erase our sins and help us gladly to forgive and to do good to those who wrong us:

C: And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

L: We know the evil one seeks to destroy our souls. The world lures us to ruin by appealing to our fears. Guard us from the poison of misbelief and the trap of unrepented sin:

C: And lead us not into temptation.

L: Keep safe our bodies and souls, our property and honor, and above all send the Holy Spirit to preserve our faith in Christ which leads to life everlasting:

C: But deliver us from evil.

L: For all of this we look to you as King of Kings and Lord of your church and our lives:

C: For thine is the kingdom,

L: For all of this, and whatever else you see fit, we trust in your loving truth and your power to rule over our lives:

C: and the power,

L: We worship you from whom all blessings flow:

C: and the glory forever and ever.

L: Relying on Jesus, who cancelled our sins and made us acceptable in your sight, we pray with confidence:

C: Amen. It shall be so.



Familiar Biblical stories form the foundation for our Sunday Lenten series: *Rend your Hearts, Claiming the Promise*. We've explored the story of Noah and the sign of the covenant and Abraham and Sarah and the command to walk before God. We will be looking at the Ten Commandments in a new way, as well as the story of Moses. The promises of God are written on our hearts and help us to live in community with one another. They are what propel us out into the world to be the very hands and feet of our Lord as we seek to serve the neighbor and make this world a better, brighter, kinder, and more just place for everyone.




